# A Message from Pastor Brian

In 2021, I am praying that the Holy Spirit would give us a deeper love for God's Word. I am encouraging us all to read through the entire New Testament in 2021. A reading plan for the year will be available soon. While you may have a method for studying the Bible already that works, I encourage you to continue to use that method. If you don't, one method that might be helpful is the SOAP method explained below:

**Scripture** – Read through the passage slowly. What words or verses stand out to you? Write them down on your sheet/journal. Focus your attention on these words or verse.

**Observation** — What is God saying about Himself? What does it say about sin and people's need for a Savior? What does it say about Jesus? Does the passage instruct about how to live life? If

so how? What is going on before and after the verse or phrase you are focusing on? Write some of these answers on your sheet.

**Application** – Now it's time to look at your life. How is God asking you to respond? How will this apply to you, your faith in Christ and living out that faith? Write this down on your sheet

**Prayer** — Pray that the Lord will help you to apply what He has taught you so that you can give greater honor and glory to Christ in your life. Bring any other prayers of Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving or Supplication to the Lord as well. List some of these on your sheet.

We will have **SOAP** sheets available at church and on our website/Facebook page. A journal notebook might work well for you also. I encourage you to keep your sheets/notebook for opportunities of reflection.

#### A few other notes:

1) You will see on the reading plan that Sundays are a day to reflect on the sermon. The SOAP method could be a tool for reflection on the sermon for you.

- 2) At the conclusion of most books there will be a day or two to catch up if you have fallen behind or to go back and reread your notes and reflect on what Christ has taught you through the book of the New Testament you just completed. This has great value to see where the Holy Spirit has grown you.
- 3) God has called us to be a community of believers. Consider getting together with one or two people (of the same gender or a couple with another couple) so you can share what God is teaching you. Consider doing this regularly and consistently. If are interested in getting together with other people, contact the church and we will get you connected with others.
- 4) We want to get many people into contact with God's Word. Invite others to join you during this year. Whether they go to St Peter or Faith or another congregation, we want people growing in their faith in Jesus.

May the Lord bless us as we dive into His Word and talk about it with one another.

# St. Peter Voters Meeting Minutes 10-18-2020

The St. Peter Lutheran Church quarterly voters meeting was called to order by President Steve Harms at 11:05 a.m. on Sunday October 18 with 26 voting members in attendance. Pastor Francik opened with a prayer.

#### Secretary's Report

One change to the quarterly voters meeting minutes held July 19, 2020 was noted. In the School Board report, the Payroll Protection Program dollar amount should be listed as \$59,000 instead of \$50,000. President Harms asked for a motion to accept the July meeting minutes as corrected. Motion made by Logan Schardt seconded by Scott Laaker. There was no discussion and the motion passed.

#### Pastor's Report

Pastor Francik reviewed the 2020 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter church statistics.

Peter's Lutheran (LCMS), Davenport, NE. Membership gains through Confirmation were Stormi Capek, Brooke Sasse, & Allie Vieselmeyer; through transfer Kevin Kruse from Trinity Lutheran, Lincoln, NE.

Membership as of September 30, 2020 is as follows - 297 Baptized, 246 Confirmed, & 223 voting members.

- My goal for the church is to start & finish reading the New Testament in 2021. I will share a suggested reading plan in the coming months
