Greetings to you in the name of our **Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:**

It is hard to believe January is almost done. It seems like vesterday we were ringing in the new year. It will be nice this year, with Easter being a little later, to have some time before Lent starts.

Now, we are on to February. Since February 14 is Valentine's Day, I wanted to focus a little bit on love. Just as we don't give thanks only one day a year on Thanksgiving, we should not just show love to each other or our spouse only one day a year on Valentine's Day, but every day of the year. There are so many passages in the Bible that talk about love with so many different points about love. There are passages about God's love for us. how we show love for God. how we should love one another and so on.

"God loves you." A simple phrase that we have heard so often in our lives and sometimes hear it and don't ponder it because we have heard it so much. We use the word "love" in many ways in our world. "I love ice cream," "I love our cabin at the lake," "I love the Huskers." We use love when we really mean like or enjoy. Love is different. Love is more than feeling. It is an act of commitment. It shows itself in actions. The apostle John writes. "Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth." (1 John 3:18) God does not pay lip service to us when He says He loves us. He does something to show us. He did the greatest thing anyone

could do. He gave up His only Son to come to this earth to die on a cross to forgive us all our sins. Jesus did the ultimate action in dying for us and going through all the pain and torture of the cross to show us His love for us. "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13) Jesus laid down His life for us because He does love us.

God's love compels us to, not just say we love Him and others, but to show it through action. We show our love for the Lord by being in God's house consistently to learn more about Him. We show our love for the Lord by giving back to the Lord in our treasures. We show our love for the Lord by being in His Word, in our devotional life and in Bible Study. We show our love for others by seeing someone in need and rallying around and helping them. We don't try to pawn them off on someone else, we seek to help them. When someone is lonely, we go and visit them. When someone we know hasn't been at church for a while, we reach out with a kind word to them. God's call for us is one of action, because that is what love is. It is an act of commitment to another person. Christ was committed to us, and He proved it. His love leads us to do the same.

I leave you today with one final word concerning love. It is those wonderful. comforting words from St. Paul in Romans 8:38-39, "For 1 convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." May you

reflect on Christ's love and show His love every day.

Providing a salad or dessert for a funeral or other luncheon


