Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:

I pray that God continues to bless your Lenten journey this year. I pray that the Lord has blessing you as we do the Red Letter Challenge and look at God's mercy on Wednesdays.

What a great joy it is, again this year, to celebrate Confirmation for our 8th graders. The Holy Spirit continues to work through the Word and I am so very thankful for each of these students and the journey that God is bringing them on. Each student has many gifts and talents and it is a blessing to see how God is working in their lives. I am looking forward to April 10 and Confirmation Sunday. I encourage you to take some time to reach out to these students and encourage them in their walk with Christ. It is important that our young people have that assurance that God has provided others around them in their journey of faith.

There isn't much better during the church year than Holy Week. Even though we hear the same story year after year, I pray that it never gets old. I love taking that journey every year with Jesus on the road to Jerusalem with shouts of "Hosanna!" Then we

see Jesus in the Upper Room leaving us an amazing gift of His body and blood. We then see Jesus on trial before several different people before eventually being led to the cross where He would face the punishment that we deserved to face because of our sins. But it doesn't end on Good Friday. Easter Sunday, we get to hear and shout and proclaim that Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia! There is no greater phrase in all the world than to proclaim that our Savior Jesus is alive and risen from the dead.

In 1 Corinthians 15 Paul writes about the importance of Jesus' resurrection and what it means for us. He writes, "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scripture . . ." Paul had received the message of Jesus from Jesus Himself and also from the other apostles and he passed on the most important message in all the world to the Corinthians. Brothers and sisters, you and I have received this amazing message of the cross and empty tomb. Are we passing it on to other people? Are we telling them the greatest message in all the world that Jesus died and rose again for them? There are so many people who are living in darkness and going through life with no hope. We have the hope of the

cross and the empty tomb. I really encourage you to invite someone to join us for Holy Week services so they can hear the best message ever. Between the music, the preached Word, the time together, it will be a powerful week of reflection and celebrating the work of Jesus for you and me.

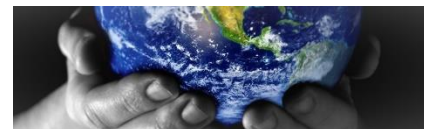
