

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:

This month I wanted to use my article to remind us how Deshler Lutheran School is supported financially.

Later in October, the school board will put together a budget. They will budget what they believe will be the expenses for 2024 and come up with a final total. The amount that the board believes will come from tuition (for any student who is not a member of St Peter or Friedensau) will be subtracted and then the rest of the amount will be divided up between St Peter and Friedensau by a formula that was created and voted on many years ago.

This formula is the percentage of the # of students from that congregation divided by total students from the two congregations. Then you add the percentage of the congregation's communicant members divided by the total of communicant members. You add those two percents together and divide by two and get the percent of financial responsibility for each church.

Below you can see it from the numbers for St Peter's support in 2023.

St Peter Students - 20 Friedensau Students - 11 Total Association Students - 31

St Peter Communicant Members - 241 Friedensau Communicant Members -105

Total Communicant Members - 346

St Peter Students -20/31 = 64.51%St Peter Members -241/346 = 69.65%64.51% + 69.65% = 134.16% / 2=67.08%

St Peter's % - 67.08% Friedensau % - 32.92%

I know we talk at different times about inactive members and people letting us know if they have moved or are going to a different church. We care about making sure they are growing in their faith and connected to a group of believers. You can also see that our membership numbers are connected to our financial support of DLS. If kids or grandkids or others have moved away or have joined another church, it is really important that we know.

Due to the way our financial support is given to Deshler Lutheran, this allows

association students our congregations to not pay tuition. Since the members don't have to pay tuition, the hope and prayer is that the money that would have been paid for tuition would be given for offering at church. We recognize that some of our families may not be able to give all of that amount, but as I wrote in the financial letter that was sent out, giving is about the heart, not about the amount. Even a small amount shows a heart that is responding to the Lord's generosity.

Please remember that the final budget is voted on by YOU at the association meeting on Sunday, November 5. It's really important for you to be there and share your thoughts. We also want input from you at congregational meetings.

DLS is such an incredible place. God is changing lives and families through the ministry at DLS. We want to make sure that DLS is around for many years to come. We want to continue to be faithful stewards and support DLS in many ways and make sure it is financially stable for the future.
