PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Last week we looked at the first source that causes discouragement, which we all suffer from at some point in our lives. Today, let's examine the second source from the Book of Nehemiah.

Nehemiah 4:10 (ESV)

"In Judah it was said, 'The strength of those who bear the burdens is failing. There is too much rubble. By ourselves we will not be able to rebuild the wall.'"

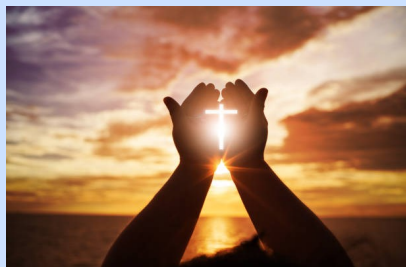
"There is too much rubble." This statement highlights the **second source of discouragement: frustration**. The Jews were building a new wall, but old, broken rocks were thrown everywhere, along with dirt and dried-out mortar. When they looked at "too much rubble," they became discouraged and lost sight of their goal. There was so much junk in their lives they didn't know how to get on with the real business of living.

Any time you undertake an important project there'll be "rubble" to remove and sometimes it gets frustrating. You can't avoid this, but you can strive to be obedient to the Holy Spirit as He guides you on how to deal with the "rubble" and not give up on God's plan.

What "rubble" is preventing you from carrying out the task God has placed before you? Trivial things

that waste your time, consume your energy, and keep you from becoming all God wants you to be? Stuff that keeps you from doing what's most important, like deepening your relationship with God, building a relationship with your spouse and children, or being active in your area of giftedness at church?

Basically, the "rubble" in life is whatever gets in your way of being the man or woman of God you have been called to be. The "rubble" is the interruptions that keep you from accomplishing God's tasks. These are the things you need to ask the Holy Spirit to help you deal with.

In other words, the "rubble" needs to go! And, like the ancient Israelites, you can't do it on your own. The Holy Spirit works through you and others to ensure that the "rubble" is removed.

Think about Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and how God instructed them to care for it. It's in maintaining the blessings God has given you and listening to God that you learn the difference between what's important in life and what's not. That's a lesson you'll keep learning over and over.

Frustration is another of the big causes of discouragement and it can show up at any time. Bottom line: the "rubble" needs to go!
