## PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

**S**o far in our study of discouragement, we've looked at the first two sources: fatigue and frustration. Today, I want to examine the third source from the Book of Nehemiah.

### Nehemiah 4:10 (ESV)

*"In Judah it was said, 'The strength of those who bear the burdens is failing. There is too much rubble. By ourselves we will not be able to rebuild the wall'."*

*"By ourselves we cannot rebuild the wall."* This statement highlights the **third source of discouragement: failure**. As the Jews were building a new wall, they quickly came to realize that they could not accomplish the task on their own. Instead of turning to the Lord, however, they conceded failure and were about to give up, complaining, "We're too tired. It's not possible. It's foolish to even try." Because they were unable to finish the job as quickly as planned, their confidence plummeted; they lost heart and became discouraged.

How do you handle failure in your life? Do you sit down and hold a pity party? Do you say, "Poor me! I can't get this job done?" Do you start complaining, "It's impossible. It can't be done. I was a fool to even try?" Or, do you blame other people, saying they let you down, they didn't do their part of the job.

The difference between those who succeed and those who fail is that those who succeed see failure as a temporary setback. They've learned to look beyond the failure, whereas those who fail see failure as permanent. Each time those who succeed get knocked down, they follow the advice of **Proverbs 24:16 (ESV)**: "... for the righteous falls seven times and rises again."

There's a saying: "In the confrontation between the stream and the rock, the stream always wins—not through strength but through perseverance." It's when faithfulness is most difficult that it's the most necessary.

So, when you get discouraged stand on the scriptural promise of **Hebrews 10:35-36 (ESV)**: "Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised."

Failure is yet another of the big causes of discouragement, and it can show up at any time. Bottom line: trust in the Lord, seek His will, be brave, be patient, and you will succeed in fulfilling His will! Remember it is the Lord at work in you and He never fails.
