How to Avoid a Shipwreck, Part 3

ere is the final point on how to avoid shipwreck. You can't afford to be guided by circumstances alone. Acts 27:13-15 (ESV) says, "When a gentle south wind began to blow, they saw their opportunity; so, they weighed anchor and sailed along the shore of Crete. Before very long, a wind of hurricane force, called the Northeaster, swept down from the island. The ship was caught by the storm and could not head into the wind; so, we gave way to it and were driven along."

It's foolish to ignore what God says, even when your circumstances seem to contradict it. Things may look good to you right now, yet you could be sailing straight into a storm. You say, "This decision must be okay because I feel so good about it." Do you

remember the words from Debby Boone's old hit song: "It can't be wrong when it feels so right"? Feelings can lie and if God says, "Wait in the harbor," you'd better do it, because the Devil can arrange undesirable circumstances if you put out to sea.

It's foolish to ignore what God says, even when your circumstances seem to contradict it.

Notice the words: "When a gentle south wind began to blow, they saw their opportunity." When it comes to the important decisions in your life, there are some very specific Scriptures you can stand on:

- Psalm 5:8 (ESV): "Lead me, LORD, in your righteousness because of my enemies—make your way straight before me."
- Psalm 25:5 (ESV): "Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long."
- Psalm 27:11 (ESV): "Teach me your way, LORD; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors."
- Psalm 143:10 (ESV): "Teach me to do your will, for you are my God; may your good Spirit lead me on level ground." When you pray that way, God will guide you in the right direction."

Each retreat can accommodate up to eight individuals. The staff for each retreat includes two counselors, a chaplain, and volunteers who provide outstanding hospitality.

All Shepherd's Canyon Retreats are held at Standing Stones Conference & Retreat Center, fifteen miles west of Arizona's "Cowboy Town," Wickenburg, Arizona, 90 minutes from the Phoenix airport. The name, Standing Stones, comes from Old Testament references to Samuel, Joshua, Jacob, and Moses, who erected rock monuments to commemorate a great work of God's grace and mercy.
