

Attending worship and hearing God's Word is accepted as an important part of our Christian lives, but is it necessary for me to make personal devotions a part of my Christian life? The answer is yes. One hour a week in worship encompasses only a very small portion of God's Word.

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 (ESV) says, 4"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. 5You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 7You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. 8You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. 9You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

The good news is that there are numerous options for personal devotions. You can pick a strategy to read through the Bible or choose a devotional that leads you through God's Word with helpful insights.

Picking your own strategy to read through God's Words has the advantage of being picked by you. If you have a favorite book of the Bible, this gives you an opportunity to dig into Holy Scripture that you have an interest in. Many people will use this strategy to read the Psalms or Proverbs. The disadvantage is that you are on your own to try and understand the vague or difficult parts. This means seeking out aids or someone to help you understand what God's Word says.

Choosing a devotional written by someone else has the advantage of someone already digging into God's Word and giving you insights that hopefully help you understand God's Word. The disadvantages are that you might be looking for deeper understanding of a different part of the Scriptures looked at and can even raise more questions for you. Another, possibly more harmful disadvantage is that the person giving the insights into God's Word may have a different understanding of God's Word or have a different theological understanding from your own.

True personal devotions should include prayer before and after digging into God's Word. Praying to the Holy Spirit asking for Him to open your eyes, ears, heart, mind, and soul to the Scriptures you are going to read before You study God's Word helps you to focus and be prepared for the Holy Spirit's revelation to you. Praying to the Holy Spirit after your reading of God's Word and asking for guidance in using what you have learned from God's Word is equally important.

teach them to your children, talking of them when you are sitting in your house, and when you are walking by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. <sup>20</sup>You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, <sup>21</sup>that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land that the LORD swore to your fathers to give them, as long as the heavens are above the earth. <sup>22</sup>For if you will be careful to do all this commandment that I command you to do, loving the LORD your God, walking in all his ways, and holding fast to him, <sup>2</sup> then the LORD will drive out all these nations before you, and you will dispossess nations greater and mightier than you. <sup>24</sup>Every place on which the sole of your foot treads shall be yours. Your territory shall be from the wilderness to<sup>12</sup> the Lebanon and from the River, the river Euphrates, to the western sea. <sup>25</sup>No one shall be able to stand against you. The LORD your God will lay the fear of you and the dread of you on all the land that you shall tread, as he promised you.

The words of God from Deuteronomy 6 and 11 make it clear that God's Word is important and we cannot spend too much time in it. The fact that Jesus is the Word of God made flesh makes it all the more important for us to be in God's Word. Ask yourself, "Is there something more important than spending time with Jesus (being in God's Word)?"
