Our sinful human nature leads us to do the absolute minimum that is required in any situation. The Air Force used to have a saying, "Aim high!" The Army had a saying, "Be all you can be!" They also had a saying, "We do more before 9 am than most people do all day." Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ calls us to seek to do more than just what is necessary.

Matthew 5:48 (ESV) says, ⁴⁸You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect. This word from our Lord definitely calls us to do more than just the minimum. Jesus says in Luke 6:37 -38 (ESV), ³⁷"Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be

forgiven; ³⁸give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." Jesus definitely calls us to do more than just the bare minimum that God requires of us to live our Biblical lives.

Notice, He didn't say, Only give to those who can give back to you. John Bunyan, the author of Pilgrim's Progress, said, "You haven't lived today until you've done something for someone who can never repay you."

In the days of Jesus, a Roman soldier could legally force a Jewish civilian to carry his heavy backpack for up to a mile. That was his right and their refusal could mean your demise. To walk the first mile was to do only what was required. Then Jesus came along and said in *Matthew 5:38-42 (ESV)*, ³⁸ You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' ³⁹But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. ⁴⁰And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. ⁴¹And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles. ⁴²Give to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you. Why? Because an extra-mile of service gives you an opportunity to impact the lives of others. A person with an extra-mile attitude is someone who cares more than others think is wise, risks more than others think is safe, dreams more than others think is practical, believes more than others think is
