Don't be Afraid – Part 1

People's fears come in a variety of forms and the consequences of those fears are just as varied ranging from minor to debilitating.

Mark 4:40 (ESV) says, ⁴⁰He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?"

Notice how the disciples reacted to the storm on the Sea of Galilee and see if you recognize any of the same traits in yourself.

First, fear makes us doubt God's care. The disciples asked Jesus, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' (Mark 4:38 (ESV)). The disciples didn't ask Jesus if He could still the storm, nor did they ask Jesus if He was aware of the storm, neither did they ask Him if He had any experience with storms. Instead, they asked if He cared. When <u>we</u> allow it, fear will erode our confidence in God's love and make us forget His faithfulness.

Secondly, fear makes us reach for control. Jesus was asleep, so the disciples woke Jesus in hopes that He would save them. Fear comes from a perceived loss of control. When we're afraid, we grab for a component of life that we can manage - like our diet, our job, the neatness of our house, or in many cases - people. The more insecure we feel, the more controlling we tend to become.

Thirdly, fear makes us forgetful. Matthew 8:16 (ESV) says, That evening they brought to him many who were oppressed by demons, and he cast out the spirits with a word and healed all who were sick. What a résumé! But fear gives us spiritual amnesia; it makes us forget what Jesus has already done and how good He has been to us. What was Jesus' response? *"Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?"* It should be no shock to us that we find *"fear not"* 27 times in the New Testament alone.

Faith doesn't eliminate fear. Faith silences fear, robs it of its power, and draws us closer to God. When that happens, things begin to change for the better. Listen to Jesus your Lord and Savior when He asks you, "Why are you so afraid?"

Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Christ has died! Christ is risen! He will come again!
