Overcoming Temptation – Part 1

2 Chronicles 20:12 (ESV) says, ¹²O our God, will you not execute judgment on them? For we are powerless against this great horde that is coming against us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you."

When Jesus told Peter he would soon deny his Lord, Peter boasted, Others may, but not me! Yet within a few hours he was swearing and disavowing any knowledge of Jesus. It can happen to any of us. James 1:14 (ESV) says, ¹⁴But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. We all have areas of vulnerability which, if not disciplined by God's Word, prayer, Holy Communion, Christian fellowship, and service to others, have the potential to defeat or even destroy us. What can you do?

First, you can recognize your desires and vulnerabilities. Before you yield to temptation you usually go through certain stages. By neglecting being in God's Word, prayer, and Holy Communion, you become indifferent to God, insensitive to danger, and find yourself drawn like a moth to a flame. Then you begin to rationalize your disobedience and think, nobody knows and what harm will it do? The more you silence the voice of conscience, the stronger your carnal appetites become. Then you surround yourself with people who do the same things, or are at least willing to look the other way. Jesus says in *Mark 14:38 (ESV), "³⁸Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."* Pray for strength before the temptation comes!

Secondly, reach for help. When Jehoshaphat came up against an enemy too big to handle alone, he prayed, in 2 Chronicles 20:12 (ESV), ¹²O our God, will you not execute judgment on them? For we are powerless against this great horde that is coming against us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you." Jehoshaphat knew he was no match for the enemy and he knew where to turn for help. What's the secret of victory? Lean entirely on God and not on yourself!

Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Christ has died! Christ is risen! He will come again!

2023 Northern Illinois District (NID) Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) Fall Gathering Gifts From the Heart (September 29 & 30, 2023)

Voice of Hope Behind the Wall Ministry NID has evolved in the past three years reports Deaconess Lori Wilbert. After 34 years of working behind the wall at Stateville Prison and working in ministry within the NID 38 years, Deaconess Wilbert has transitioned into working with those being released from prison in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

The teaching ministry at Stateville continued during the COVID shutdown with the blessing of the warden and with staff he assigned to the ministry. Prison staff delivered class lessons and assignments to the cell houses each week, picked them up, and sent them back to Deaconess Wilbert. This teaching model continues.

Upon their release, former prisoners need items that help an individual set up an apartment. These Gifts from the Heart will enable each person to have a solid start as he re-integrates into his community.
