### **Overcoming Temptation – Part 3**

Genesis 39:6-12 (ESV) says, <sup>6</sup>So he left all that he had in Joseph's charge, and because of him he had no concern about anything but the food he ate. Now Joseph was handsome in form and appearance. <sup>7</sup>And after a time his master's wife cast her eyes on Joseph and said, "Lie with me." <sup>8</sup>But he refused and said to his master's wife, "Behold, because of me my master has no concern about anything in the house, and he has put everything that he has in my charge. <sup>9</sup>He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" <sup>10</sup>And as she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not listen to her, to lie beside her or to be with her. <sup>11</sup>But one day, when he went into the house to do his work and none of the men of the house was there in the house, <sup>12</sup>she caught him by his garment, saying, "Lie with me." But he left his garment in her hand and fled and got out of the house.

Joseph finds himself in a very tempting position. Notice in verse 10 that Potiphar's wife kept pressuring Joseph to lie with her.

Joseph's temptation kept happening when he was around a certain person: Potiphar's wife. And it kept happening when he was in a certain place: Potiphar's house. So he ran. Not because he was weak - but because he was wise! He understood that if you hang around temptation too long you're playing with fire and setting yourself up to get 'burned'. So, what people and what places do you need to avoid? What sources of temptation do you need to remove from your life in order to live victoriously? Remember the old Kenny Rogers song: 'You got to know when to hold 'em, know when to fold 'em; know when to walk away and know when to run'? God isn't dishonored when you run from your temptations - you're dishonored when you don't!

In the Lord's Prayer we say, "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from sin." God doesn't tempt us or lead us into temptation. We are asking God to lead us away from temptation and give us the strength, wisdom, and willpower to avoid and run away from the temptations we recognize and know.

Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Christ has died! Christ is risen! He will come again!
