


Why are we here?

As of February 5, the maternity home in Dundee has begun accepting applications for new residents. Housing and programming is available for pregnant women whether they choose to parent or share their baby through the gift of adoption Residents live in a family-style community and gain skills in infant care, job readiness, financial literacy, and more. All programming is focused on helping residents to live full and independent lives. The home welcomes up to four women at a time and features a live-in residential manager. Daily family-style meals and weekly worship will foster a strong community. Residents will find help securing pre and post-natal healthcare as well as behavioral health support.
