Dealing With the Devil – Part 4

Jesus' temptation in the wilderness is the gameplan we need to follow as we face our own temptations from Satan. When Jesus fought the devil in the wilderness, Satan never landed a single punch. Three times Jesus told him, *it is written (Matthew 4:4, 7, 10 (ESV))*. With those three Biblical rebuttals, Satan was unable to go any further. It was game over for Satan.

Let's look at the third of Jesus' temptations. Matthew 4:8-9 (ESV) says, ⁸Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. ⁹And he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me."

Satan is telling Jesus, "If you serve me I'll take you all the way to the top." The world and Satan would have you believe that being at the top and basking in the glory is the way to go. Why wouldn't Satan tempt you in this way? When you're shooting for the glory, you're attempting to glorify yourself and your following Satan. When you seek to glorify God, you're being led by God.

Satan is all about pride. Pride is the very essence of Satan. His fall from Heaven is preceded by the lofty aspirations found is *Isaiah 14:13-14 (ESV)* which says, ¹³You said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; above the stars of God I will set my throne on high; I will sit on the mount of assembly in the far reaches of the north; ¹⁴I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High.'

Satan wants to take God's place, but God isn't moving. Satan covets God's throne, but God isn't abdicating. Satan wants to win you to his side. The truth is: you can't defeat Satan with your own strength, but you don't have to.

The Bible says in Hebrews 4:16 (ESV), ¹⁶Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. We need to follow Jesus' example and rely on God's Word to refute and defeat Satan. It's not about us and it's all about God.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Christ has died. Christ is risen. He will come again!

The Rite of Foot Washing During the Maundy Thursday (the Thursday before Easter) service, it is customary to have congregants come forward and have someone, usually the pastor, symbolically wash one or both of their feet. It involves the pastor or another person pouring water over their foot or feet and then patting it or them dry with a towel. This is done in remembrance of Jesus' command to follow His teachings and love, forgive, and serve one another by following His example of washing the feet of those we serve. Just as Jesus doesn't look at our dirt, dust, scars, imperfections, and deformities, the person symbolically washing your foot or feet is focused on serving you.

John 13:1-20 (ESV) says, ¹Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. ²During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him, ³Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God, ⁴rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. ⁵Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him. ⁶He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?" ⁷Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." ⁸Peter said to him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" ¹⁰Jesus said to him, "The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean. And you are clean, but not every one of you." ¹¹For he knew who was to betray him; that was why he said, "Not all of you are clean." ¹²When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? ¹³You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. ¹⁴If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. ¹⁵For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. ¹⁶Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. ¹⁷If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. ¹⁸I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled, 'He who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me.' ¹⁹I am telling you this now, before it takes place, that when it does take place you may believe that I am he. ²⁰Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."
