Sverdrup Lutheran Church Council Minutes May 13, 2025. 7:00 pm

In attendance: Else Andersen, Bruce Leitch, Dianne Beckman, Tereasa Link, Michelle Jevne, Dale Jacobson, Stephany Wold, Sharon Kline, Daryl Eberhardt, Dick Mattfeld, Tina Frigaard, Nicole Woodman, Thea Rothman, Pastor Tammy Jacobson, Anne Stenoien and visitor, Paul Shol. The meeting was called to order by Council President Else Andersen at 7:05. Dianne Beckman made a motion to accept the agenda, and Michelle Jevne seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Dianne led us in a devotion about "finding myself in the Bible story."

The secretary report from the April 2025 was reviewed. Tereasa Link made a motion to approve the minutes, and Nicole Woodman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Tereasa Link shared the Financial Secretary's report. In April the monthly general fund income for the church was above our goal, but typically it decreases with lower attendance in the summer months. Dianne Beckman reviewed the Treasurer's report. The Ledger Balance on 4/30/25 was \$81079.02 and the Cleared Balance was \$81182.23. We try to have enough in our accounts to cover 2-3 months of expenses. Michelle Jevne made a motion to approve the financial reports. The motion was seconded by Tina Frigaard and the motion carried.

Paul Shol shared information on Fergus Falls Area Habitat for Humanity. Their mission is to put God's love into action by bringing people together to build affordable homes that give hope to families in our local communities. Since 1991, they have provided 66 homes in West Otter Tail County. We learned about a building partnership and the tax credit for individual donations. We are still looking for a lot in Underwood to build hope and stability for a family.

Else Andersen gave a report on information from the executive committee. We will not host "a meet the bishop candidates" since Bishop Tesch is the only candidate. The Rural Revival program is progressing with Pastor Melissa Pickering interviewing members, neighbors, businesses, and school personnel. We will hear from her again after this part of the process. The quality of the sound of the grand piano in the sanctuary seems to carry better on the live stream/ recorded service when the cover is closed. Our pianist, Val, has helped by selecting music for the service and agrees to the need to keep the top open only for large crowds at church. The power point slides have been difficult for some to see with the colored background. Our church secretary, Karen Terry, has adjusted to white background with black print. We also discussed the problem of the sunlight glaring in through the windows as the seasonal light has changed. The projection people will check the shades to block the sunlight when necessary. The youth fundraisers were successful with the Easter breakfast raising \$899 and the pie auction provided \$3591. These funds will be used for their trip this summer. The committee working with the Global Refuge program will share information after they meet again.



The church office computer needs replacing. Three bids were secured for the computer, keyboard, and mouse. Tereasa Link made a motion to accept the bid by Affordable Solutions for a Dell. The price of \$1,109 includes set-up and the recycling of the old computer. Dick Mattfeld seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Sharon Kline reported for the Property and Management Committee. The roofing project caused damage to the paver walkway at the main entrance. Outdoor Renovations have been contacted for repairs. A metal facia will also be repaired. There was discussion on the organ fund requirements.

Michelle Jevne reported for the Worship and Stewardship Committee. They updated the worship bags for kids and have reserve materials to share when needed. The pew cards have been updated. Summer outdoor services will be held the "last Sunday" of June, July, and August 2025. Substitutes for Pastor Tammy's absences on Sundays for synod assembly and trips have been secured. Members have signed up to assist as Communion servers. It was decided to use the communion rail for the first Sunday and use the standing style on the third Sunday. We will work with Tingvold to have an outdoor service together in August.

Thea Rothman reported for the Education Committee. Sunday School is over for this school year. She thanked those who assisted as teachers. Vacation Bible School plans have not been finalized.

Tina Frigaard and Nicole Woodman reported for the Life and Fellowship Committee. The scholarships were announced in church. The new picture directories have been distributed. Senior Sunday with special quilts for all the students was held on Mother's Day. This may be held earlier next year. Sverdrup hosted the Baccalaureate service for the Underwood School class of 2025. Tina sent invitations to the students and gave them each a cross keychain.

Pastor Tammy Jacobson thanked all the people who have helped with the many activities at Sverdrup Lutheran. She is looking forward to the NW MN Assembly and Bishop Installation in June and she was selected to attend the church-wide assembly in Phoenix in July. She will go with the youth to Duluth and the North Shore in June. The funds raised by the youth will pay for most of the trip and each family is responsible for the fee. She shared an itinerary and an expense sheet for the trip. Eleven students and four chaperones are going. She reported that the confirmation classes will have their final class in May.

We discussed old business items of goals, Baccalaureate, and the Global Refuge during the committee reports.

There were three New Business items on the agenda. An "In-Kind Giving" form was developed by Tereasa Link to use to document items from donations. We already practice this information, but did not have a form to use. The form will be put on the church website for use by members.



Volunteers are needed to help with mowing and trimming at the Sverdrup cemetery. We will announce the need at the worship service and through the newsletter.

A new member is needed for the Life and Fellowship Committee as Logan Frigaard is resigning. The term is for 2 ½ years and the council will need to elect a successor to fulfill his term.

Our next meeting will be held on June 11, 2025. Tina Frigaard volunteered to lead the devotions in June. Tereasa Link made a motion to adjourn, and it was seconded by Sharon Kline. We adjourned at 8:48 and closed with the Lord's Prayer.









Sverdrup Ladies Aid History Tidbits
