Pastor's Corner

In just a few days I'll be among you as your new pastor, and it's exciting to think of what God has in store for me and for you as we move forward into a new chapter in the ministry of Timothy Lutheran Church. After all we get to share Jesus' love with each other, the little children at the preschool and community in which we live. I plan to get to know you through chats and visits, but for now let me share a little about myself.

I've been a pastor for twenty-five years and Timothy will be the fourth congregation I have served. Previous congregations were in Missouri, Iowa, North Carolina and Florida. After thirteen years of living in Florida, I'm looking forward to experiencing true seasons once again.

As for my life before the ministry, I was born in London, England, the sixth child of American parents. My dad was a Lutheran pastor who moved to England in 1957 with my mom and three children. My two other brothers were born in Wales, which makes me the only real "Englishman". My three brothers still live in England with their families. One sister lives in Australia and other sister lives in Knoxville TN.

I came to the U.S. in 1989 and have managed to keep two "British" things about myself. My accent, which has been woefully diluted over the years, but is still noticeable. I also drink hot tea with a splash of milk and sweetener. Unfortunately, I've never gotten used to putting ice in tea. I'm sure southern sweet tea can be quite refreshing, but for me and most of the British, icing down tea is quite the abomination! Apart from that I believe I have assimilated quite nicely into apple pie American life.

Not long after coming to the U.S. I met my future wife Heidi and entered the seminary at Fort Wayne. It did stand me in good stead that I became engaged to a professor's daughter. Heidi and I were married during my seminary years. Heidi has stood by me through all my years of ministry and currently works at Immanuel Lutheran School. Oh, and she drinks coffee; iced coffee!

In our twenty-seven years of marriage we've been blessed with three children. George, Charlie and Annie Rose. George is a 6' 10" tall red head. Yes, he did play college basketball for Lipscomb University in Nashville and made an appearance in the March Madness tourney of 2018. He is now a project manager at Hospital Corporation of America in Nashville. He is married to Emily who is preparing for medical school. Our other son Charlie is finishing up his associate's degree and works at a nearby pet store. He loves to write fiction in his free time. He hopes to complete his undergrad work, maybe at Kennesaw State. Annie Rose is a sophomore in high school. She loves playing the piano and her favorite genre is classical. Annie has played in Immanuel's bell choir and was eyeing up your bells during our recent visit to Timothy.

My love for God's Word, especially in its original languages, leads me to want to share it with others. There's something exciting about sharing the great gospel message of Jesus' death and resurrection and the Lord has blessed me with the ability to share with people of all ages. There is no better satisfaction than singing with preschoolers "This Little Light of Mine," to preaching and teaching adults, to sharing the Word with shut-ins. Bringing the Word to hospital bedsides and those under hospice care is an essential part of my pastoral being.

To conclude I want to leave you with something to think about. Timothy has just celebrated forty years of ministry. What a great achievement!! As we celebrate the past let's begin to think about the future. How do you envision Timothy's forty-five year celebration or even Timothy's fiftieth anniversary? It's something to ponder as **WE** begin this new chapter together in the life of Timothy Lutheran Church.




