

Pastor's Corner

Dear Christian saints at Timothy Lutheran Church and beyond:

Grace and peace to you from God the Father and our Lord and savior Jesus Christ.

We are blest that the world is in a better situation now than it was a year ago. This time last year there were questions about kids going back to school, how businesses might gradually reopen and how we could safely gather together for church services.

Thankfully children will return to school in August. In most places businesses are fully open. At Timothy we returned to our "normal" pre-COVID worship practices on Pentecost Sunday, May 23. Even though cases of the Delta variant of COVID are on the rise, the COVID pandemic is now, to coin a great phrase "in the rear view mirror," meaning the worst is in the past.

As a Christian congregation we face some difficulties and challenges as we emerge from the pandemic. Many have gotten used to NOT coming to church on a regular basis and feel more comfortable with their morning coffee, in their pajamas watching church from the comfort of the living room couch. While that worked well during the pandemic and we were able to reach out with God's Word and the Gospel of Jesus, now that the pandemic is effectively over there really is no excuse for able bodied people not to come to church.

Remember one of the Ten Commandments addresses the subject of worship. God says in the third commandment, "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy." The Catechism explanation of the commandment states, "We should fear and love God so that we not despise preaching and God's Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it." Since Jesus fulfilled all the Sabbath Law, New Testament Christian's are fortunate to hear God's Word and receive God's grace in the sacraments on any day of the week. Over two millennia Christians have traditionally gathered on Sundays to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. As I teach Catechism students— every Sunday should be a little Easter celebration with Easter Sunday being the greatest celebration of the resurrection.

The writer to the Hebrews emphasizes the need to hear God's Word in Hebrews 2:1, "Therefore it is necessary to more abundantly give heed what we have heard, lest we should drift away from it." If someone was giving away a million dollars to everyone who came to church on Sunday, would you show? Probably!!!!

We do not gather on Sundays to receive financial wealth from our gracious God, but we do receive an abundant wealth of FORGIVENESS OF SINS, through the sufferings and merits of Jesus Christ our savior. Every Sunday we receive the blotting out of all our sins through the blood of Jesus and the certainty of eternal life through the resurrection of our savior. Sure, a million bucks would be great, but I'll take the FREE GIFT of forgiveness of a million sins and the certainty of eternal life in heaven after death!!

Just in case some you are thinking, "well I must be great because I haven't stopped going to church," I can assure you that you are not. If you attend church for the right reason you should be thinking as the writer to Hebrews encouraged Christians, "24 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good works, 25 not leaving behind assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" Hebrews 10:24-25.

It is the responsibility and privilege of all Christians to encourage one another, literally to provoke each other to go to church to receive God's grace in Divine Service. In other words we should be encouraging each other now more than ever, **NOT TO LEAVE CHURCH IN THE REAR VIEW MIRROR**. Yes, leave COVID in the rearview mirror for sure, but not church.

We all need what God offers through Jesus Christ in Divine Service, the forgiveness of sin, life and salvation. So I challenge us all to "provoke" each other to attend Divine Service on Sundays, to receive God's great and wonderful grace and mercy.

Thank you for your generous donations! Whether you brought in items or contributed toward the shipping costs of approximately \$2,000 you were an important part of this project. *Our goals were met all around!* We are deeply moved by the congregation's and the preschool's response and we give thanks to God for each of you!

Elizabeth Ratliff, our missionary friend, also extends her thanks. She is thrilled at the enthusiastic support of her ministry. *Because of your support* we have 20+ totes to ship! She will use all the sewing items, books, sheets and towel, and tools to support 24 village orphans, 6 elderly people, the 15-Mile Orphanage and others in the coming year.

Ms. Ratliff's update to our church in June included many photos, videos and stories of those she serves. Her ministry in Zambia runs the gamut from funding bore holes for water, helping orphans and elderly, Bible study groups, evangelism to the many non-Christians through loving service, teaching skills to women and so much more. The Discipleship Bible Study is also being taught and she is able to provide some audio Bibles (a "Proclaimer", available in as many as 4 languages), which allows everyone to hear the Gospel in their own language. This is a great blessing and especially important for those who are solely oral learners or for those in a more isolated population.

Two things have stayed with us since her presentation – (1) their excitement on receiving the simplest of things you provided last year and (2) the exuberant rejoicing in their worship of the Lord. It was inspiring!

The goods Timothy shipped in 2020 were put to many wonderful uses, and it was uplifting to hear how God's provision through you, the church and preschool, changed lives in Africa!

For example, Timothy sent 4 sewing machines last year. While Elizabeth didn't have specific people in mind for them, she was able to share them with someone teaching both newly-Christian and non-Christian women to sew. They were thrilled to have the machines for the group so these women would be able to have a skill and an opportunity to feed and support their families. Beyond that economic blessing, *more of the non-Christian women are hearing about Jesus and coming to faith as they learn to sew.*

She told us that God is doing amazing things in Zambia. The strong name of Jesus, our God of love, is on the move and changing hearts. The Good Friday service was planned and catered for 700, but 900 new Christians and non-believers came to the service. The effects of prayers and faith are producing wonderful outcomes, drawing even more people to God.

An example of the perfection of God's timing is in the story of Peter, a Zambian handyman. He was at Elizabeth's home doing some work and she offered him some of the 'how-to' information provided in 2020. He was very excited to find information on building certain cabinetry – something he was undertaking the next week. The step-by-step diagrams helped him improve his understanding of the project and expand his knowledge. She said he found it on Friday and was using it on Monday!

Copies of her most recent *Ratliff Report* are on the LWML bulletin board.

Lastly Elizabeth asked for our prayers and referenced Matthew 9:38, where Jesus said, "³⁸ *therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.*" Please pray for more believers to make themselves available and respond to the call to missions.

Elizabeth is with Missionary Ventures, Inc., an organization in Maitland, FL, that helps and serves with indigenous pastors.

The Blessing of Community

Here we are, approaching the *end of summer*. The school year will start soon and vacation travels to visit family and friends, postponed from 2020, are winding down. It's a time that is a little bitter-sweet, exciting for what is to come, and yet there is a sense of gladness to be back home, all rolled into one. In youth, the beginning of school was always a favorite time of year – the pile of unused school supplies, a few new clothes, seeing friends from last year and making new ones, and the thought of what *could be* in the coming year. Now, *as an adult*, it is the thought of cooler weather, fall colors and crisp mornings that build my anticipation!

Community is relationships, it is a great blessing in our lives and takes a number of forms – our neighborhood, our town, school friends, family relationships, adult friendships and, of course, our church community. We don't always give much thought to being part of these communities, but they play an important part in our well-being throughout our lives. In a society where we seem busy being busy we often want a list / an outline / bullet points / cliff notes, etc., to hit the highlights before we check off what has to be done and move on. That doesn't seem to leave time to experience community.

Many studies on being part of faith communities have a list of similar benefits. We are challenged to grow in our faith, our relationship with God deepens and our gifts and talents are revealed. We learn how to work through conflict, as well as give and receive forgiveness. Going to church is shown to reduce stress, strength our social ties, remind us of our identity as children of God, and as part of a community, and remind us of the deeper meaning of life. There are many others – one *article listed 102 of them, large and small!*

A previous stewardship newsletter article stated, *"Our connections to each other through worship, ministry, socializing and friendships help to strengthen our Christian family. Combining our individual gifts makes us stronger because, as it turns out, our gifts are meant to complement each other. Simply put, we are better together. We were meant to be in community with each other."*

One of the easiest ways to develop relationships is to serve somewhere in the Timothy community. Pick something near and dear to your heart, or try something completely new. We have many individual talents, but no one person has every talent, nor can one person do everything. Each of us is an important part of the body of Christ and *everyone* has something to offer.

Think about coming to church a half-hour early or lingering after to catch up with someone you haven't seen in a while. You might even come to fellowship hall between the two services for coffee and the Bible study. *Be sure to visit with old friends and maybe make some new ones!*


