Pastor's Corner

The Life of the Savior—The Devil's Viewpoint

Even though Lent doesn't start until Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, I thought it would be good to introduce the midweek sermon series for this year.

As we journey through Lent we are going to take a unique look at the life of Jesus leading up to Jesus' crucifixion. From Jesus' conception to his death, we will consider how the devil viewed Jesus and God's plan for our salvation through him. The following are brief summaries of what to expect each Wednesday evening during Lent. As you read these summaries remember that they come from the devil's viewpoint.

Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022

Jesus' Conception and Birth:	Readings	Genesis 3:1-19 Romans 5:12-17, 1 Corinthians 1:27-29 Luke 1:34-38, 2:1-12
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The devil looks at the conception and birth of Jesus as complete weakness on the part of God. That God would stoop so low as to become human to save humanity is beyond the devil's comprehension. The devil believes he has the upper hand against God because of the weakness of mankind. He tempted Adam and Eve and they fell; he can tempt Jesus and maybe he will fall.

Thanks be to God, that he sent his son to be the second Adam and overcome sin, death, and the devil.

Wednesday, March 9, 2022

The Temptation:	Readings	Deuteronomy 8:1-3 1 Corinthians 10:12-13 Luke 4:1-13
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On the second Wednesday we get a glimpse of the devil's real "modus operandi" or mode of operation. As in the Garden of Eden the devil seeks to cast doubt on the goodness of God and what God has said in his Word. The devil questions Jesus' divinity, tempting him to misuse his divine power. But Jesus answers the devil using God's Word. Jesus' gives us the answer to temptation: God's Word!

Wednesday, March 16, 2022

The Garden of Gethsemane:	Readings:	Lamentations 3:1-9, 22-33 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 Luke 22:39-46
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The devil taunts Jesus with his impending trials and death thinking he can make him break his resolve to go to the cross. "Go ahead Jesus pray for another way" the devil says. But there was no other way. Jesus did have to suffer and die, it was the only way to pay the price for ALL sin. Where we want our way and will done, Jesus did his Father's will for us.

Wednesday, March 23, 2022

Jesus Trial before the Sanhedrin:	Readings:	Isaiah 50:5-7 Acts 4:5-12 Luke 22:63-71
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The devil seizes the opportunity to tempt Jesus again. "Why go through all this Jesus, the mockery, pain, the humiliation?" After all you don't have to do it. Why go through all this for sinful rebellious mankind? Just look at how they are treating you now Jesus, and you are willing to suffer all this for them?" Thankfully, Jesus was willing to go through all of it for us.

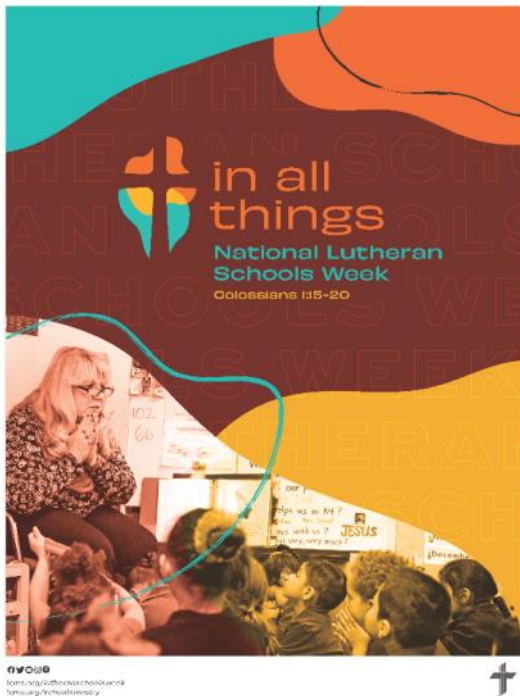

Habitat Build – 2022

Our habitat house build this year will begin on February 26 and we will have three build days:

2/26 – First Nail Ceremony - Framing

3/12 – Siding and Insulation

4/2 – Interior Painting

The house is located at 761 Britt Road in Mableton where the build day will start at 7:45 am and end approximately at 4 pm. A bagged lunch and water will be provided. Safety protocols for COVID include temperature checks each morning, face masks for indoor work and a pre-build day questionnaire the day before we build. We will be working with the Northwest Metro Atlanta Habitat affiliate this year. The house will cost \$110,000, up significantly from previous years. The Lutheran Coalition contributed \$40,000 towards this build. The Lutheran Coalition also contributed \$7,500 towards a build by the North Central Georgia affiliate. If you would like to have additional or different build days, they should be available either with NW Metro Atlanta or North Central Georgia affiliate. However these three dates are reserved for the area Lutheran churches only. Timothy will be providing lunch on 4/2. Please contact Don Snyder or Mike Lawson for more information then come and join us.

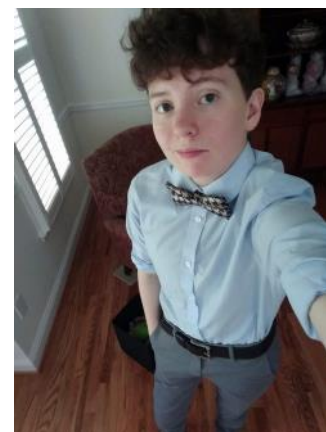

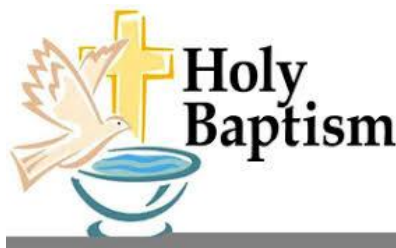

- 1 cup pearly barley
- ½ cup sundried tomatoes
- 1 Tbsp dry minced garlic
- 1 Tbsp dry minced onion
- 1 veggie bouillon cube
- Glass pint jars with lids
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Pen

What you do:

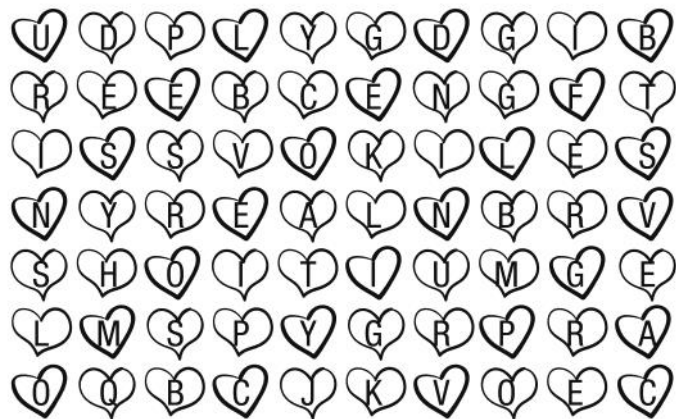
1. In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar.
2. Trace the outline of the lid onto cardstock. Cut out.
3. On the card, write these directions: Remove wrapper from bouillon cube. Add contents of jar to saucepan. Add 4 cups water and a can of diced tomatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce to low. Simmer about 20 minutes, until barley is tender. Serve with parmesan cheese.
4. Place the card atop the lid. Screw on the canning ring to keep it in place.
