.Back to School; Back to Listening and Learning

"We should hold on to the confession of our hope, resolutely, for the one having made the promise is faithful, and we should consider each other, how to stir up to love and good works, not abandoning our assembling together, as is the custom with some, but exhorting (each other) so much more as you see the Day drawing near." Hebrews 10:23-25

(Jesus said) "He who has ears, let him hear." Matthew 11:15, 13:9, 34

Summer break has ended, and a new year of school has started. Children move from one grade to another as they get older. Parents are amazed at how fast their children are growing and learning. I often council parents not to "blink," because in a "blink of an eye" children go from being precious preschool students to precocious teenage high schoolers.

We wouldn't have it any other way though. We want our children to grow and learn. One of the most important lessons we can teach our children is to LISTEN. Rambunctious children, who can barely sit still for five minutes, have problems listening. This is due to short attention spans that we hope will get longer as they grow up.

One of my favorite things to tell preschoolers at Timothy is, "Listen and learn." I encourage them to listen and pay attention to the grown-ups around them. The message is simple, "If you're not listening, you won't learn." What's amazing is that three-year-olds understand the message, although they have difficulties putting it into practice.

Isn't this true of ALL people, no matter what age they may be? We want to speak first and listen second. We want to teach, instead of being taught, because we think we have knowledge to impart. As "grown-ups" we need to take a break and "listen and learn." If we learn to listen, then not even a day will go by when we won't learn something. Everyday becomes a learning day as we listen.

Listening to God's Word is the most important thing we can do in life. God's Word gives eternal life through the message of Jesus' death and resurrection, and what can be more important than that! We need to hear God's Word that convicts of sins yet shows us the unfathomable grace of God in Jesus who earned the forgiveness of sins for us.

As children return to classrooms we should consider continuing in or getting back to the "classroom" of God's Word. Our classroom is the weekly gathering around God's Word and sacraments in Divine Service where our savior meets us in his Word and sacraments. He meets us to forgive us, renew us and teach us what he wants us to know about his grace and salvation. We dig a bit more deeply into his Word in Bible study on Sunday mornings as well.

I hope the simple message of "listen and learn" will stir you up to listen to the love and good works Jesus did for us. We hear about that love and those good works on Sunday mornings. So, come and listen and learn.

SOCIAL MINISTRY BOARD – AUGUST 2023

Serving Jesus by serving the least (based on Matthew 25:40)

Our purpose is to address the immediate, one-time hardships of people living in Cherokee County, specifically with essential, necessary expenses. We also work with similar organizations in Cherokee County or the larger community.

2022-2023 Assistance Recap:

We ended the 22-23 budget year with \$0 in our line item budget and \$102.94 in the '17' account. We served the community as follows:

- 10 requests approved 6 utility bills, 4 rent assistance
- 3 requests declined
- 2 were referred out
- 19 provided no or incomplete documentation

THE LORD IS WITH YOU


"God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.' So we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?'" (Hebrews 13:5b-6).

Why are we so timid when it comes to sharing the Gospel with others? Would-be witnesses often cite rejection as a fear. Do you think Jesus has sympathy for us in this area? Isaiah wrote, "He was despised and rejected by men." (Isaiah 53:3) Jesus knows what it's like to suffer rejection. He lived the phrase, "Been there, done that. " Others are afraid that they will be inadequate for the task; they do not know their Bibles well enough and their defense of the Gospel is weak. Again, is Jesus unaware of our state? Read the interchange between God and Moses in Exodus 3-4. Yes, we are inadequate; yes, there are mysteries in the Scriptures that we will not understand till we're in Heaven; and, yes, we won't have the proper words to say. Jesus said, "Do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time [the time when you need it] you will be given what to say, for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you" (Matthew 10:19-20)

God loves us so much that He gave His only Son to die for us. That Child was born into a powerless family living in an unstable world. Yet the will of God was accomplished. Will He not also accomplish His purpose through us, powerless and inadequate as we are? It is **His** plan and **His** work, not our own, as He reiterated His promise to be with us to accomplish His will through us. So **give it all you've got!**

Read Joshua 1:5-9. Use your Bible helps to list as many times as you can find where God promises to be with us in all kinds of situations.

Prayer: Dear Heavenly Father, forgive us for our excuses. Help us to learn through the lives of Moses and Joshua and the prophets and disciples that You never forsake Your people and that You are present to help us carry out Your will on earth. Thank You for the opportunity to be stewards of the Gospel. Through Jesus Christ. Amen.



What a relaxing way to spend a hot August afternoon with your TLC family!





Kid's Corner




Use simple ingredients and your imagination to bake these fluffy, cloud-like treats.

What you need:

- 3 egg whites
- ½ tsp. vanilla extract
- Mixer
- 2 Tbsp. powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp. cornstarch
- · Parchment paper

What you do:

- 1. Preheat oven to 300°. In a mixing bowl, combine egg whites and vanilla. Whisk eggs with mixer at medium speed until frothy.
- 2. While whisking, gradually add sugar and cornstarch. Keep whisking at high speed until stiff peaks form.
- Spoon mixture onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Create fun shapes.
- 4. Bake 20 minutes. Cool and enjoy!
