Pastor's Corner

Will Artificial Intelligence Replace Preachers?

I recently read an intriguing article entitle "AI-Powered Preaching: How Much Should Silicon Valley Impact Sermon Prep?" The article is available online at Lifeway Research. The article focused on "ChatGPT" a free artificial intelligence platform launched at the end of 2022. I didn't realize how much artificial intelligence has been around for decades and how much it is used already, "Our smartphones use it to confirm our identity with facial recognition. Banks employ AI to determine if purchases seem likely to be fraudulent. From social media to online shopping, AI offers recommendations based on past interactions."

But what's different about ChatGPT when compared to the AI that's been around for so long? One reads, "The generative aspect of recent AI advances is what makes it unique. Traditional AI has been used to analyze data and make predictions based on those inputs. Think Amazon suggesting you buy a new book from an author you've read on Kindle. But generative AI, like ChatGPT and others, creates new data based on its training. It can generate images when given prompts and text responses to questions, like identifying benefits and drawbacks for pastors using AI for ministry." ChatGPT is not a predictive platform, it's generative. This makes it different from normal AI.

I see Chat GPT as most technology. It's a double-edged sword. As a pastor in Georgia wrote, "ChatGPT can be good as a research aid," he said, "but any type of 'ghostwriting' would be no more ethical than passing off another person's sermons or commentary as your own work." (Rev. Griffin Gulledge, Madison Baptist Church in Madison, Georgia).

A few months ago, a member at Timothy approached me and asked about generating a Bible study with ChatGPT. He wanted me to "vet" the study. When I read the study, based on the parameters given the AI, I must admit I was impressed with the capability of the program to generate what it did. Here it comes though, HOWEVER, a program is only as good as its programming. It was obvious to me that the AI was not capable of distinguishing the two most important teachings in the scriptures, law, and gospel. The result of the study contained "the law" and little or no gospel. The primary function of law in scriptures is to show our sin. The Gospel shows our Savior and the grace of God. This is where ChatGPT could become a deadly tool of the devil robbing sinners of the pure gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ. Turning salvation into a work rather than the total grace of God in Christ Jesus.

I'm very secure in the thought that artificial intelligence will never replace biblically based preaching. I do believe it can be a helpful tool just like any interlinear Hebrew-Greek Bible program. There is no replacement for solid reading, studying and learning God's Word, after all "..faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Romans 10:17.

Read Ecclesiastes 5:10. How old is the problem of greed? Read also Matthew 6:20. Should we be greedy for spiritual treasure?





Timothy's Cupboard (Food Bank) Update Serving Cherokee County for over 30 Years

Timothy's Cupboard - Status Update

Over the next several weeks, the Food Bank Ministry Board will be working with the Food Bank volunteers to drive consensus on the long-term viability of its operation – either to restructure, downsize or close the Food Bank due to insufficient number of volunteers (volunteer burnout) and no food bank managerial leadership starting in 2024.

Starting in August, we are progressing forward with the plan to migrate the hardcopy paper client files to digital format. We have updated the food bank laptop and have started to utilize Oasis Insight software (web-based / cloud- based) for the digital format transition. The estimated monthly cost for two users is \$40 for the 'basic' version of the software. Digital migration will likely take months.

Timothy's Cupboard Results through August 2023

The table below highlight the results of the eight months of 2023.

The results of the first eight months continue to look promising to be better than the past two years, but still below the performance of previous years (between 2018 and 2020).

This extrapolated forecast is close to 77% of any of those years.



MISSIONARY-MINDED PRAYER


An important part of missions is prayerfully supporting the church. Use this activity to guide your family's prayer time.

What you need:

- Plastic bag (large zippered)
- · Permanent marker
- Bandage
- Toy plane
- Heart-shaped drawing or toy
- · Spoon
- Coin
- Hot-sauce packet

What you do:

- Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).
- 2. Add small prayer-prompt objects to guide your prayer time (bandage = health, plane = travel, heart = relationships, spoon = cultural connection, coin = finances, hot sauce = boldness).
- 3. Include other objects that will prompt prayer for missionaries' specific needs.
- 4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.
