

A Reflection on Psalm 8

This Psalm is understood by many as a psalm of the incarnation. Hebrews Chapter 2 identifies this psalm as about Christ. For whom else than the Son of God could say these words in this way.

[1] O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens.

- The first "Lord" here is the Hebrew word Yahweh, God's personal name
- The second word "Lord" is Adonai, Hebrew for King/Lord used to address someone in authority
- Our God is majestic, is above every the heavens

[2] Out of the mouth of babes and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.

• Luther comments: "this is the way of God's Kingdom is established namely not with human force, wisdom, counsel, or power; but with the word and gospel preached by infants and children. By infants does not mean young children who cannot talk; but plain simple unsophisticated people who are like infant children in that they set aside all reason, grasp, and accept the word with simple faith and let themselves be led and directed by God like children, Such, people are also the best scholars and pupils in Christ Kingdom."

[3] When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, [4] what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?

- This is where the book of Hebrews starts to quote this passage and attribute it to Christ
- "Son of Man" is title Christ himself used frequently to refer to himself

[5] Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. [6] You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet,

• Psalm 21:6 leads in the same direction "For you make him most blessed forever; you make him glad with the joy of your presence."

[7] all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, [8] the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.

- Everything is under his dominion, this can only be Christ
- Matthew 28:18 "And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."
- 1 Corinthians 15:27 "For " God has put all things in subjection under his feet." But when it says, "all things are put in subjection," it is plain that he is excepted who put all things in subjection under him."
- Ephesians 1:22 "And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church,"

[9] O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!


- The Psalm ends almost like it started

flowers with heart-shaped gift tags. All this is available for the consumer so that he can find the appropriate expression of his devotion to his loved one. If that expression of love has been preceded by a year of thought-ful and loving words and deeds, it is welcomed and cherished by the recipient. If not, it is just an empty ritual, done out of duty rather than true devotion.

Our relationship to the Lord is similar. He, too, desires our sincere devotion, not empty lip service. "The Lord says: 'These people come near to Me with their mouth and honor Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from Me'" (Isaiah 29:13).

Stewardship is serving, helping, giving, but love is the basis for stewardship. Without love, our good deeds are empty and without merit. The first act of true stewardship is to *"love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength"* (Deuteronomy 6:5). Jesus called this the most important commandment (Mark 12:29, 30). With that love for the Lord in us, we are enabled to be good stewards. Then we can do acts of good stewardship, acts of true devotion. We are enabled to ...

"Give generously to Him and do so without a grudging heart" (Deuteronomy 15:10).

"Carefully observe [His decrees and laws] with all your heart and with all your soul" (Deuteronomy 26:16).

"Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13).

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).

God, through Ezekiel, promised, "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put My Spirit in you and move you to follow My decrees and be careful to keep My laws" (Ezekiel 36:26-27). This promise He has fulfilled in His Son, Jesus, Who has followed His Father's decrees and kept His laws for us. As we strive to live fruitful lives of stewardship, at the same time, we rest in Christ Who has been the perfect steward for us.
