AS WE GATHER

This morning begins a four-week series on one of the most beloved verses from the Bible, the 23rd Psalm. Each week we delve deeply into the language of this beloved prayer, to (re)discover God's grace, mercy and peace, and to rejoice in the work of Jesus our Shepherd. In our first service, Shepherd and Sheep, we will see what our Lord Jesus, the Good Shepherd, has done to create us anew as "the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand" (Psalm 95:7). CONFESSION OF SINS AND GOD'S WORD OF FORGIVENESS

Elder: Let us approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we

may receive mercy, and find grace to help us in our time of

need.

Silence for private confession and reflection.

Elder: Most merciful God:

Congregation: We confess that like wayward sheep, we have often turned

away from You. In our speaking, thinking, and doing, we have sinned, failing to heed our Shepherd's voice. In Your mercy, deliver us from the death we deserve, and grant to us the life we do not, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Good Shepherd.

Elder: Jesus was given over for our sins, but raised for our justification.

Congregation: In Him we have been raised from the dead.

Elder: If the Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, dwells in

you, then He who raised Christ from death will also give you life. Arise, therefore, your sins are forgiven you, in Jesus' name. You

are free to live in the name of your Shepherd and Savior.

Congregation: The Lord is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

FIRST READING *Isaiah 40:9-11* (The greatness of God.)

⁹ Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news;
lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news;
lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!"
¹⁰ Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and His arm rules for Him;
behold, His reward is with Him, and His recompense before Him.
¹¹ He will tend His flock like a shepherd; He will gather the lambs in His arms;
He will carry them in His bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

Congregation: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE READING 1 Peter 2:22-25 (Brought back to our Good Shepherd.)

²² He [Jesus] committed no sin, neither was deceit found in His mouth. ²³ When He was reviled, He did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but continued entrusting Himself to Him who judges justly. ²⁴ He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed. ²⁵ For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

Congregation: Thanks be to God.

Thine forever, God of love! Hear us from Thy throne above; Thine forever may we be here and in eternity!

Thine forever! Shepherd, keep these Thy frail and trembling sheep Safe alone beneath Thy care, let us all Thy goodness share.

Thine forever! Thou our guide, all our wants by Thee supplied, All our sins by Thee forgiv'n; lead us, Lord, from earth to heav'n.

READING OF THE GOSPEL John 10:11-16 ("I Am the Good Shepherd.")

Elder: The Holy Gospel, according to St. John, the tenth chapter.

Congregation: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹¹ [Jesus again said to them:] I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep. ¹² He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know My own and My own know Me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. ¹⁶ And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to My voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

Elder: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Congregation: Praise to You, O Christ.

REFLECTION ON THE CATECHISM – 1st Article of the Creed w/explanation

Pastor: I believe in God, the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and

earth. What does this mean?

Congregation: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has

given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife (husband) and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.
