AS WE GATHER

In Matthew 25 Jesus teaches what to focus on when we think of His return. In three separate parables He directs our attention, but not outwardly, or to specific dates and times. In fact, He makes it clear that such details are not part of our business (and in fact, are likely unhealthy for us to know)! Instead, in each of the parables, He directs our attention to the inward working of His grace in lives of faith. In this Sunday's Gospel lesson, the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins, Jesus shows us the importance and significance of patient waiting for Him.


EPISTLE 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18 (*The Day of the Lord is coming.*)


