VARIOUS READINGS ON SERVICE

*Isaiah 58:6-8

6 "Is not this the fast that I choose:
 to loose the bonds of wickedness,
 to undo the straps of the yoke,
to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?
7 Is it not to share your bread with the hungry
 and bring the homeless poor into your house;
when you see the naked, to cover him,
 and not to hide yourself from your own flesh?
8 Then shall your light break forth like the dawn,
 and your healing shall spring up speedily;
your righteousness shall go before you;
 the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard.

*Acts 9:36-42

³⁶ Now there was in Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which, translated, means Dorcas. **She was full of good works and acts of charity.** ³⁷ In those days she became ill and died, and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. ³⁸ Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him, urging him, "Please come to us without delay."

³⁹ So Peter rose and went with them. And when he arrived, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping and showing tunics and other garments that Dorcas made while she was with them. ⁴⁰ But Peter put them all outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. ⁴¹ And he gave her his hand and raised her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. ⁴² And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

1 Corinthians 12:4-7

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of service but the same Lord. ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, *for building up the body of Christ*,

Ephesians 6:5-8

⁵ Slaves, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, ⁷ *rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man*, ⁸ knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a slave or free.

1 Timothy 2: 8-10

⁸ I desire then that in every place the *men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarreling;* ⁹ likewise also that women should adorn themselves in respectable apparel, with modesty and self-control, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly attire, ¹⁰ but with what is proper for women who profess *godliness-with good works*.

Titus 3:1-8

¹ Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, *to be ready for every good work*, ² to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. ³ For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. ⁴ But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, ⁵ he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. ⁸ *The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works. These things are excellent and profitable for people.*

Matthew 5:13-16

¹³ "You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. ¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so **that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.**

SPIRITUAL PRACTICES:

Every morning for the next two weeks ask your spouse, relative or colleague, "What can I do for you today?" Then, do it. Talk to God about what this is like for you. What do you see about yourself as you serve in this fashion?

Volunteer to serve in an invisible type of service at Trinity. Perhaps with the altar guild or the screen/slide team, or maybe the Sunday coffee setup/clean-up team. What is it like for you to work behind the scenes? Did you enjoy giving yourself to that invisible role that so many are counting on?

Volunteer to serve in a very visible act of service at Trinity. Perhaps as a lector, or a greeter. How does that form of service fit your talents and gifts?

Ask a good friend or loved one to give you their take on what your serving strengths are. Plan a way of using one of those strengths to benefit others in the coming week or month.
