AS WE GATHER

The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter are essentially one worship service – continuing for three consecutive days. Historically these days are called the **Triduum** in Latin, simply meaning "the three days." Our theme for this year's services is: "Return to the Table ... the Cross ... the Empty Tomb"

In this worship service, we focus on the seven Words that Jesus spoke and prayed from the cross. Jesus had no epitaph. He left no legal Last Will & Testament. However, during our Savior's final hours, He left us Words of great hope and mercy. From His first breath to His last, these seven simple sentences, uttered amidst suffering and complete surety, have sustained many a soul in their time of uncertainty and need. Jesus' Words still beckons us, as He is given and shed "for you." Therefore, welcome to today's worship. Welcome to ... hope!

<u>Note:</u> this afternoon's service ends in silence. As all three services of Holy Week form one continuous service, there will be no invocation or benediction in this service, which stands at the crux of the other two. As we have come to reflect on the covenant which our Lord made – sealing it with His very life – may we be blessed to know that He has done it for us. There is no greater promise. There is no greater gift!

PRE-SERVICE MUSIC

As worshipers enter today's service, you are invited to proceed forward toward the chancel, where a large wooden cross has been placed. Hammers and nails are provided. Adults assist children, and all worshipers are invited to contemplate Christ's sacrifice by hammering individual nails into the crossbeams.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Congregation: Help us so to remember and give thanks for our Lord's Passion,

that we may receive forgiveness for our sins, and salvation to eternal life for all who believe this Promise; through Jesus

Christ, our Lord. Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING Isaiah 52:13-53:12 (*He was pierced for our transgression.*)

¹³ Behold, my servant shall act wisely; He shall be high and lifted up, and shall be exalted.

¹⁴ As many were astonished at you—
His appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and His form beyond that of the children of mankind—

¹⁵ so shall He sprinkle many nations.

Kings shall shut their mouths because of Him,

for that which has not been told them they see, and that which they have not heard they understand.

53 Who has believed what He has heard from us?

And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?

² For He grew up before Him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground;

He had no form or majesty that we should look at Him, and no beauty that we should desire Him.

³ He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces. He was despised, and we esteemed Him not.

⁴ Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows;

upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed.
⁶ All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way;
and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

⁷ He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.
⁸ By oppression and judgment He was taken away; and as for His generation, who considered that He was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?
⁹ And they made His grave with the wicked and with a rich man in His death, although He had done no violence, and there was no deceit in His mouth.

¹⁰ Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush Him; He has put Him to grief; when His soul makes an offering for guilt, He shall see His offspring; He shall prolong His days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in His hand. ¹¹ Out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied;
by His knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant,
make many to be accounted righteous, and He shall bear their iniquities.
¹² Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the many,
and He shall divide the spoil with the strong,
because He poured out His soul to death
and was numbered with the transgressors;
yet He bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

EPISTLE READING Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9 (Jesus the great High Priest.)

¹⁴ Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. ¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶ Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. ...

⁷ In the days of His flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to Him who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverence. ⁸ Although He was a son, He learned obedience through what He suffered. ⁹ And being made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him.
