





Chimes Council Report:

If you've been following church stresses and strains over the "letters" and their meanings, you'll know that some council members have paid a high price in their continuing attempts to remain faithful to their callings and available for new issues as they arise.

Since I'm a relative newcomer to both the church and the council, I'm not intending to address old issues or personal experiences, but merely some thoughts I've had over our priorities as servants of the Master.

The Apostle Paul wrote of the prioritized beliefs and action of serious Christians, a calling to which he had no parallel. In his letter from a Roman prison cell to the Christians at Philippi, he wrote about his desires to rise above the power of his flesh and the power of personal involvement in their struggle. He writes: "I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death" (Phil. 3:10 NIV).

Today at Trinity Lutheran we are personally involved whether we like it or not. Do we know "of Jesus," or do we merely "know about Jesus." There is a high cost for true discipleship since to gain that high calling may also cost us entering into "the power of his Resurrection," and the "fellowship of his suffering," as we become increasingly crucified with him at Calvary.

Differences between Christians offer more opportunity than personal threat. We have a great opportunity to become more involved with the personal Jesus and through our momentary suffering to experience anew the fellowship that sometimes only fellow sufferers can achieve.

Paul went on to describe how he strains toward the mark, pressing on toward the goal that is God's reward. We have an opportunity now to do likewise, so let's look at our differences more as opportunities than as burdens.

Charge to the Trinity English Lutheran Church Capital Improvement Task Force

May 2019



The purpose of the Capital Improvement Task Force is to identify and document equipment and structures in Trinity's buildings or on Trinity's property that need replacement, repair, maintenance, or refurbishment, and to provide cost and schedule estimates for the work that needs to be done. Specifically, the task force shall

- 1. Review the work of previous documents, including the Vision 2020 report, that apply to capital improvement, and list items or actions in these documents that are still relevant to Trinity's property and facilities.
- 2. Communicate with existing Trinity committees (such as the Property Committee), staff, and other working groups (such as Spit and Shine) to review and add to actions that need to be taken.
- 3. Prioritize actions that need to be taken. Criteria for ranking the priority of actions may include
 - A. Preventing damage to property. High priority is assigned to equipment or structures whose failure will cause substantial damage.
 - B. Likelihood of imminent failure. High priority is assigned to equipment or structures that may fail sooner rather than later.
 - C. Compliance with existing laws for building codes. High priority is assigned to repairs, refurbishment, or replacement that are needed to comply with the latest laws and codes.
 - D. Time, trouble, or cost to fix. High priority is assigned to equipment or structures that are fast, easy, and cheap to fix or replace.

The Task Force will try to strike a balance between competing criteria when assigning a priority.

- 4. Obtain estimates for the cost and schedule of repairs, replacement, or refurbishment.
- 5. Write a report for distribution to the Church Council that presents a prioritized list of the equipment and structures that require attention, the actions that need to be taken, and estimates for cost and schedule.
- 6. Attend a Church Council meeting to present this report, answer questions, and participate in discussions.
