Dear Trinity Family and Friends,

As we look forward to the month ahead, let me ask you... How does The Word shape your life?
THE SECOND BUILDING BLOCK OF FAITH OR MARK OF A DISCIPLE = READING /STUDYING GOD'S WORD

According to a research project, the following amazing statistics were reported:

80% of Americans named the Bible as the most influential book in human history.

91% of all households own a Bible and the typical household has three Bibles.

38% say they read the Bible every week outside of church.

Among the Bible readers, they spend an average of 52 minutes per week (10 minutes reading daily).

22% say they have read the entire Bible.

On the other hand, 12% said the name of Noah's wife was Joan of Arc.

As Christians, we believe the Bible is God's word and throughout the month of November we will look at the importance of reading, knowing, and living God's word.

Pastor Michael W. Foss in his book <u>Power Surge</u> states, Clearly the book is out there, but apparently it gathers more dust than readers. As a church we are again faced with the fact that making a paradigm shift from a membership model to a discipleship model requires crafting a new congregational culture. In the membership model, the Bible is a tool for the pastor and, at best, an accessory for the average member. In the discipleship model, the Bible is a part of everyone's tool kit.

If most of us opened a carpenter's tool kit, we wouldn't know what to do with most of what we found inside. Using the tools of any trade requires the development of skills through mentoring, practice, and experience. It's no different with the Bible, the key tool is the discipleship trade.

"Pastor," he said, "I really understand the need to read the Bible daily. In fact, when I don't do it, my world kind of gets out of whack. My problem is that I don't know how to get past some of what I read. I mean, not only do I not understand it, I don't even like it!"

Comments like these are neither uncommon nor surprising. But the sad reality is that we will continue to hear them until our churches become communities where folks are not only encouraged and expected to read the Bible, but are equipped to do it. The expectation is important and needs to be clearly communicated, but without providing people with non-intimidating, practical opportunities for learning how to use this tool it will all be for nothing, and the tool will stay in the tool kit – unused.

The Christian reality is that the Bible is at the center of our life together, which means this foundation of our individual lives of discipleship needs to be continually lifted up. Throughout the month of November we will be focusing on Study as a building block of faith. Please plan to join us each week as together we focus on both the blessing and the challenge of being God's people, faithfully involved in the study of God's word.

#### Charge for the Pearl and Elmer Nelson Bequest Task Force

The Pearl and Elmer Nelson beguest is an undesignated bequest that was given to Trinity Lutheran Church in 2015. Trinity bylaws require half of all undesignated gifts over \$5,000 to be placed in Trinity's endowment fund, and this was done in 2016. 10% of the remainder was designated by Church Council to match second Sunday offerings. A portion has been used to pay for Leaderwise consulting. There is now a need to determine how to disperse the remainder. The Pearl and Elmer Nelson Bequest Task Force will identify uses to which the remaining funds may be applied, and also suggest how much of the fund should be distributed to each use. The task force will present its findings and recommendations to the Trinity Church Council. If you are interested in being on the Bequest Task Force, please submit your name to Amber by Sunday, November 17. The Bequest Task Force will be appointed at the November Church Council Meeting.






