Mary sits at Jesus feet and listens to Him.*

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the tenth chapter:

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

³⁸ Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. ³⁹ And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." ⁴¹ But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, ⁴² but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

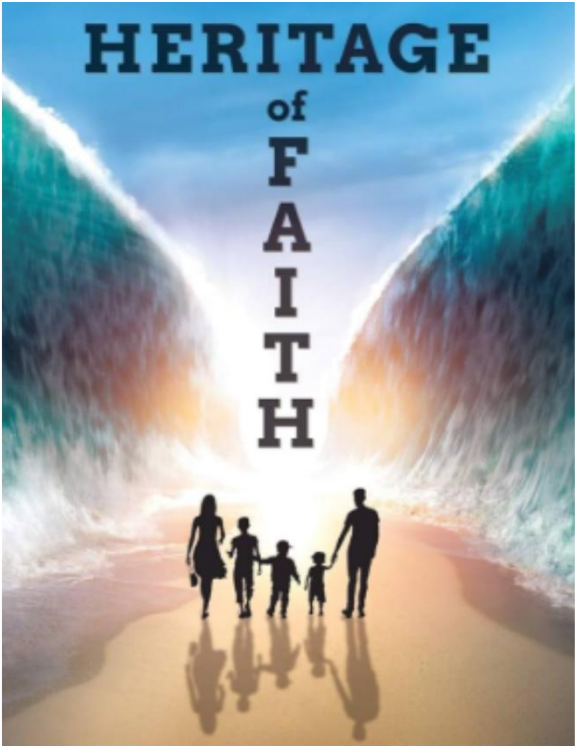

Opening Psalm Psalm 27:1-6

P: The LORD is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear?
C: The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid
P: When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh
C: my adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall.
P: Though an army encamp against me my heart shall not fear
C: though war rise up against me, yet I will be confident
P: One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after
C: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in His temple
P: For He will hide me in His shelter in the day of trouble
C: He will conceal me under the cover of His tent; He will lift me high upon a rock.
P: And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me
C: and I will offer in His tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the LORD

Old Testament Reading Genesis 25:19-26

Isaac and Rebekah are faced with the trial of childlessness. But, through faith Isaac prayed to God, and the LORD granted his prayer and gave them two sons, Esau and Jacob.
P: The Old Testament Reading for today is from Genesis, the Twenty-fifth chapter:

¹⁹ These are the generations of Isaac, Abraham's son: Abraham fathered Isaac, ²⁰ and Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah, the daughter of Bethuel the Aramean of Paddan-aram, the sister of Laban the Aramean, to be his wife. ²¹ And Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, because she was barren. And the LORD granted his prayer, and Rebekah his wife conceived. ²² The children struggled together within her, and she said, "If it is thus, why is this happening to me?" So she went to inquire of the LORD. ²³ And the LORD said to her, "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you shall be divided; the one shall be stronger than the other, the older shall serve the younger." ²⁴ When her days to give birth were completed, behold, there were twins in her womb. ²⁵ The first came out red, all his body like a hairy cloak, so they called his name Esau. ²⁶ Afterward his brother came out with his hand holding Esau's heel, so his name was called Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them
P: This is the Word of the Lord.

The Epistle Hebrews 11:1-2; 20-21

Isaac and Jacob passed on the conviction of faith to future generations. Their faith was a blessing to the generations that followed them.
P: The Epistle Reading is from Hebrews, the eleventh chapter: Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ² For by it the people of old received their commendation...By faith Isaac invoked future blessings on Jacob and Esau. ²¹ By faith Jacob, when dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, bowing in worship over the head of his staff.
P: This is the Word of the Lord.
C: Thanks be to God.
