That's how Christmas was, is, and must ever be. Let your celebration focus on the Christ Child, our Savior and His gift to us, and yours will be a blessed Christmas regardless of the circumstances under which you now live.

Our Mission dollars at Work

For the month of December, Trinity Voters have elected to send all of our mission receipts to the Nebraska District office for administrative and program support.

Beginning January 2019 our receipts available for missions will change. Instead of congregation members specifying their mission contributions on the front of their envelopes all receipts will be added for the month and 10% will be designated for missions. \$500 will be sent to the special mission as previously voted and the remainder will be sent to the Nebraska District office for their support. This was approved at the October voters' meeting and is in keeping with biblical teaching.

Since the 2019 envelopes are already on order, they will look the same as 2018 envelopes. Please disregard the mission side as it will not apply. If you have any questions, please talk to Pastor Kohnke or Rosanne McClarnon.

Quarterly Voters Meeting was held on October 29th. The Wedding guidelines were updated with changes that were discussed at the previous meeting and were approved by the voters. A new mower for the church was approved for purchase. The Ladies aide asked for approval to buy a second refrigerator for the kitchen. The single one, while bigger, still didn't have enough room for everything when a funeral is held. It was voted that memorial money would be used to pay for half of the cost of the fridge, the Ladies Aid will pay the remainder. More debate on the new church sign was held but was again tabled for further investigation is needed to determine the best placement and type of sign needed.

Ladies Aide Report: meeting is held on the 3rd Thursday of every month in the church basement at 1:30 p.m. In November the Ladies Aid pass out small mite boxes to all the members. They would like you to collect your penny's during the week in your mite box and then bring them to church and put them in the big mite box in the Narthex. The money is then sent to the district and is used to help with missions and various scholarships. There is a list of all the Mission grants that are



affected/helped by your mites! If you didn't get a mite box please let one of the Ladies know and they will be happy to get you one!!
