Vacation Bible School Teachers: Servants of the Lord

Many years ago, when I was a child, Vacation Bible School was held for two weeks., from 9 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. A teacher who endures 14 days of VBS, I think is eligible for sainthood. Selma Judas and Florence Gohlke were two teachers, now sainted, whom I recall with fond memories from my years as a V.B.S. student. Mrs. Judas’s classroom for V.B.S. was the cry room located just off of the narthex. A table and hard, brown, metal chairs were set up for the 14 days. Students were expected to bring their own Bibles, and pencils. When a student forgot a pencil, it wasn’t to the church office that Mrs. Judas went darting but into her own purse she dug for a writing utensil. By the intensity of her teaching, you knew she believed the Words of Scripture she taught. She instructed with authority and, as I recollect, received well deserved respect. The demeanor she gave to the class was that she was joyfully serving the Lord.

Mrs. Gohlke was my teacher when I was but a small lad. Games of duck-duck-goose, and tag are cherished memories. Mrs. Gohlke even joined in our childhood games. Craft time was filled with simple things. We made plaster of paris forms of praying hands, and crosses. Perhaps the simplest yet most memorable craft were items we made from the pre-glued strips of multi-colored paper. Every creation was an opportunity for Mrs. Gohlke to praise us for our work. And Mrs. Gohlke’s most notable task, at least to us kids, was the work she did on Friday, day 14! She was the Aid Association for Lutherans (AAL) church representative (her husband was the branch treasurer) who went and purchased our treat, chocolate **ice cream bars!**

These are but two of Christ’s servants, now in His presence, who gave of their time for God’s children. How many lives did they touch by their kindnesses and their example? How many children saw the light of Christ shining from their hearts? Only the Lord knows. I recognize I was one.

Years have passed and many people have succeeded these ladies as V.B.S. teachers, servants of the Lord. At Trinity we thank our Heavenly Father for the dedicated teachers and support staff we have had for Vacation Bible School. Our Heavenly Father continues to provide children for us to teach about our Lord Jesus. And He provides us with teachers who give sacrificially of their time to share Jesus’s love. Teachers who let their light shine. Many teachers have given extra effort working long hours in preparation for the class they taught in order to make the V.B.S. experience a joyful and intellectually stimulating one for the children.

Others gave selflessly of their time on things others may not notice...emptying trash cans, preparing food, preparing the crafts, and cleaning up.

Do these people seek our praise? No, they simply are serving their Lord with the abilities He has given.

May we all seek to serve our Savior, with the skills He has given to us, and give thanks for the ability to serve Him by serving others.

Our Work

Bible Translation: Why translate Scripture for every language?

Because when we hear God's Word through our own language – not the language of foreigners, colonizers, or overlords – then we understand how much God loves and desires us. Over 1 billion people worldwide do not have the full Bible in a language that touches them deeply. An estimated 165 million do not have a single verse of Scripture.

Deeper Engagement: Why don't we just translate, publish and move on as quickly as possible?

Because our goal is impact, not production. We work with either pre-literate or semi-literate peoples. Printed books are not a part of their life. It takes creative and intentional effort to help individuals, families, and even congregations read, hear and interact with Scripture within their daily activities. The Bible has no impact unless the Word engages deeply within.

Greater Capacity: Why invest in the emerging non-Western Christian church and Bible agencies?

Because the future of the global Church depends on it. Locally driven outreach is far more effective than expatriate missionary work alone. Building local expertise and appropriate infrastructure empowers the local church to more sustainably engage in mission.

Trinity Lutheran 2021 VBS Mission Offering

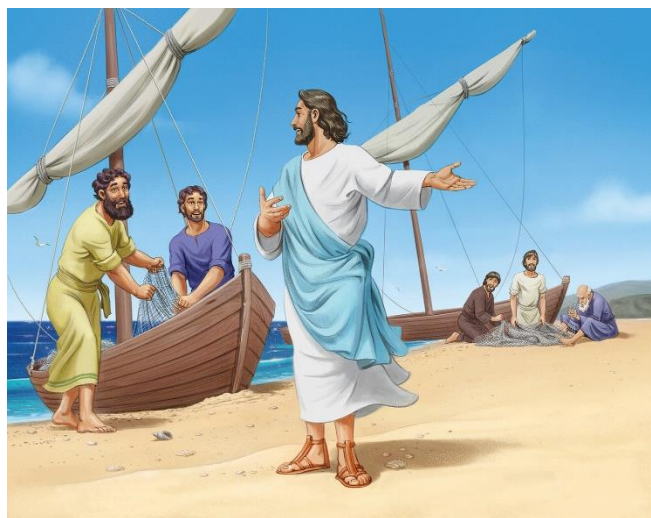
“Let the Children Come to Me” Sunday school materials for the children of Southeast Asia



The 2021 Trinity VBS mission project that we have adopted is the LHF “Let the Children Come to Me” mission project. Their offerings will go toward writing and translating a Lutheran Sunday school program for Southeast Asians in countries like Thailand, Cambodia and Indonesia.

The one-year curriculum, based on *A Child’s Garden of Bible Stories*, will be written and translated for three different age levels at a total cost of \$24,000. Conservatively speaking, at least 12,000 Sunday school students will benefit from the curriculum – a cost of only \$2 per student.

Members of the congregation may participate by donating on Sunday, June 13th. A collection will be taken at the door.
