#### **Endure**



Last month five of us from Trinity went to the LCMS National Youth Gathering in New Orleans. The trip was filled with great music, fantastic speakers, fun activities, and meaningful conversations. The trip was well worth it. Yet throughout the trip, there were many things the participants had to endure. We endured travel. We endured hot and humid days. We endured long walks. We endured long days and late nights. We endured being surrounded by twenty thousand other Lutherans. We even endured a protest of the gathering! There was a lot that had to be endured.

ENDURE This idea of enduring was fitting as "Endure" was the theme for the youth gathering. This theme comes from Hebrews 12:1-3, which proclaims: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted." More than enduring the challenges of a youth trip, we as Christians endure a lot throughout our lives. We endure hardships of every kind: sickness, broken relationships, financial crises, adverse weather, addictions, persecution, and sin and its consequences. Yet Jesus calls us to endure. We endure these hardships, but we only endure in and through Him. It is by faith in Jesus that we can endure. We endure in Jesus because He also endured much in His life. Hebrews 12:1-3 reminds us of what Jesus endured. He endured sinners. He endured suffering. He endured shame. He endured the cross. He endured our sin. He endured all of this for our sake. It was because of our sinfulness that Jesus endured all of this. Yet Hebrews 12 also proclaims that it was "for the joy that was set before [Jesus]" that he "endured the cross, despising the shame." It was out of joy that Jesus endured His suffering, crucifixion, and death. It was out of joy in saving us that He endured. It was out of joy for us that He endured. Jesus joyfully endured these things that we might receive forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life. Jesus joyfully endured these things that we might have a restored relationship with Him.

And Jesus' joy gives us joy. Even when we endure hardships, we have joy in Christ. Our joy in Jesus enables us to endure the hard things in life. We have joy in Him because of what He has given us and what He has done for us. No hardship can take away our joy in Jesus. Because of Jesus, we can and will endure!
