

The Duty of Hearers: What Church Members
Owe to the Ministry of the Word

When we think about what it means to be a member of the Church, we often focus on the blessings: the comfort of the Gospel, the joy of Christian fellowship, the nourishment of the Lord's Supper, and the faithful preaching of the Word. These are indeed gifts of God. Yet church membership is not merely about receiving; it is also about living faithfully within the vocation God has given us. According to Martin Luther's Table of Duties in the Small Catechism, one of the most important Christian callings is that of the hearer—the baptized member who receives the Word and supports the ministry.

Luther's Table of Duties gathers key passages of Scripture that apply to various Christian vocations. Among them is a section titled "What Hearers Owe Their Pastors," which draws from passages such as

1 Corinthians 9:14, which states that the Lord has commanded that those who preach the Gospel should receive their living from the Gospel. Galatians 6:6 reminds us to share all good things with the one who teaches. Hebrews 13:17 instructs us to obey our leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over our souls as those who will have to give an account. These verses teach that hearers are not passive spectators, but active participants in the life of the Church. The duty of the hearer is to attend the Divine Service regularly, to listen to the Word with humility and faith, and to support the ministry with prayer, encouragement, and material gifts. The Church thrives when her members receive God's gifts eagerly and uphold the ministry entrusted to them.

Faithful hearing involves a posture of humility. In Acts 17, the Bereans were

praised for receiving the Word with eagerness, examining the Scriptures to see if these things were so. Likewise, hearers today are called to approach the preached Word not as critics, but as those longing to hear the voice of Christ. St. Paul commends the Thessalonians because they received the Word not as the word of men but as what it really is, the word of God (1 Thessalonians 2:13). When the Word is faithfully preached, it is Christ Himself who speaks. Our calling is to hear and believe.

In practical terms, this eagerness can be shown by making Sunday worship a priority and preparing our hearts beforehand through prayer and reflection. It may mean arriving early to church, bringing a Bible to follow along, and reviewing the readings ahead of time. During the sermon, it means actively listening, resisting the urge to critique or be distracted, and afterward, discussing the sermon with family or fellow believers to apply it to our lives. It also means engaging in Bible study throughout the week, trusting that the same Christ who speaks on Sunday continues to speak through His Word daily.

Support of the ministry also includes generosity and prayer. As Paul exhorts in Galatians 6:6, those who are taught the Word are to share all good things with the one who teaches. This means faithful and joyful giving to support the pastor's livelihood and the Church's ongoing work. It also includes praying for your pastor, that he may remain steadfast, faithful, and encouraged in his calling. St. Paul often asked the churches to pray that a door be opened for the Word and that he would preach boldly as he ought (Ephesians 6:18–20).

However, support for the ministry extends beyond finances or prayers; it also includes being gracious to the person who holds the office. Your pastor is a sinner. He will make mistakes. He is limited, flawed, and weak. If you are looking for reasons to be disappointed in your pastor, you will certainly find them. But this is no surprise to God. The Lord has still chosen to place this man in your congregation to serve you with His Word and Sacraments. So, do not look for faults, but for ways to encourage and bless him. Honor the office, forgive the

man, and pray for him daily.

And just as you are called to be gracious to your pastor, so also are you called to be gracious to your fellow members. The Church is a body of redeemed sinners. We will fail each other, misunderstand each other, and even sin against each other. Yet Christ commands us to bear with one another, forgive one another, and build one another up in love. St. Paul writes, "Bear with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgive each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive" (Colossians 3:13).

When hearers receive the Word with faith, honor the office of the ministry, and treat one another with grace and forgiveness, the Church is built up in love. The unity of the Spirit is preserved in the bond of peace. Christ is glorified, and His people grow together into maturity.

So let us not take our calling as hearers lightly. It is a holy vocation. Let us hear God's Word with joy, uphold the ministry with prayer and generosity, and walk together in the unity of faith, showing the same grace to one another that Christ has shown to us. In all of this, we are not left to our own strength. Christ Himself has borne our sins, carried our burdens, and given us His Spirit. He forgives our failures, strengthens our weaknesses, and daily clothes us in His righteousness. The duty of hearers, like all Christian vocation, flows from the Gospel, because Jesus has first served us, we now serve one another in His name.

Health Note - Perfectionism and Forgiveness with Parish Nurse, Marcene Selberg, R.N.

We have often heard the phrase, "Good is the enemy of Great." In the right context it can serve as a motivation to inspire people to higher achievement. However, when striving for excellence becomes confused with unrealistic expectations, fault finding in others, or a fear of failure, then life becomes an endless report card and wellworn path of unhappiness. These characteristics are the hallmarks of perfectionism. Perfectionism can affect young people as well as adults, making one feel unhappy with one's life. It can lead to depression and anxiety, eating disorders, and self-harm. Even mild cases can interfere with the quality of life, affecting personal relationships, education and work. Perfectionism can occur in a range and may impact one or more areas of one's life. Signs of perfectionism include the following: Feeling pressure to meet increasingly high expectations, Difficulty overlooking small mistakes, Needing exact rules, expectations and negative feedback, Hypersensitivity to criticism and negative feedback, Self-worth or self-esteem that is contingent upon success. When left unchecked, these unrelenting requirements can lead to a need for professional counseling to deal with the damaging effects that perfectionism has for so many people. In the United States, the universal hotline for mental health services is 988 and operates 24 hours-a-day. Counseling is a wonderful tool for many people and should be encouraged. Services are available such as Lutheran Social Services. Christian counselors work in many agencies including online. Counseling often involves learning how to forgive. For many, forgiving others, as well as one's self, is not easy. The Greek word in the Bible translated for "forgiveness" literally means "to let go", as when a person does not demand payment for a debt. Jesus used the comparison in his parable of the unmerciful servant (Matt. 18:23 -35). Forgiving means letting go of resentments and unrealistic expectation for others and self. It keeps no record of wrongs (1 Cor. 13:5). Forgiveness involves confession. Confession is an acknowledgement, ultimately, of our sin. If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9, 10) Forgiveness involves remembering God's forgiveness. Recounting the great debt paid by Jesus dying on the cross for our sins is the power to forgive ourselves and others. Jesus stressed the importance of forgiveness in the Lord's Prayer "forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us," and that includes ourselves. Forgiveness also involves persistence and prayer. Behavior and thought patterns do not change overnight. Often we need to work overtime at forgiveness, and be persistent in prayer for real change. As we tackle the issues, we do with the confidence that, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Phil 4:13).
