# **From Our Pastor**

God's peace and joy to you. Lent is a busy time in the church year by itself. We journey through it without our All\*\*\*ias anticipating the joyful Easter celebration when we can 'let loose' once again. This year, with funerals for three of our sisters in Christ (Arlene, Marylin, and Esther), we've been reminded of the penalty that sin brought into our lives.

It may sound odd but I think it's beneficial for us, the living, to see the shadow of death. It makes it very real and it reminds us that there is no escape. Without Jesus it would just be sadness upon sadness but thanks be to God it isn't entirely sadness. Of course, we miss their presence, their conversation, the unique gifts they each possessed and used in service to our Lord. But we know that they are at rest with Jesus now. The funerals of faithful Christians are different from those who are not.

Paul tells us we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18).

Because we have a certain hope in Jesus we don't grieve as others do who have no hope. We look forward to that eternal day when we no longer have to worry about pain or suffering or sadness or grief. We look forward to seeing our loved ones again, perfect and whole and spending eternity with Jesus, our Savior.

PS: One of the more loving things a person can do is to make preparations for their funeral. Included in this newsletter is a document that will indicate preferences for music, biblical texts, hymnody, etc. Trying to make those decisions for a loved one during the emotional period immediately following their death is difficult. Having things written out reduces conflict and allows families to enter into the grieving process without more stress. I would like to have this on file. Please feel free to come talk with me about what you might like in your funeral service that provides a confession of and witness to your faith.

Looking forward to Easter! May God bless and keep you all.

## From our Pastor

#### Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #5 - Kyrie and Gloria

Kyrie means "Lord." In the Kyrie, we call out "Lord have mercy." It is not specifically a prayer of forgiveness. We have already asked for forgiveness at the beginning of the service with Confession. We use the Kyrie not unlike the way it is used in the Bible - a general call for God's help. The Kyrie should be sung in confidence knowing we have a strong and loving God who does indeed come to the aid of His people! This pleases God, for He is the one who invites us to call on Him in our need.

Having prayed for God's mercy it is very fitting to go onto the Gloria (coming immediately after the Kyrie, without a single word between, the Gloria is a response to the Kyrie itself... The Lutheran Liturgy, L. Reed). The Gloria recalls the angels' hymn of praise at the birth of Christ. It is God's ultimate answer to our call "Lord have mercy." In Christ, we have not only forgiveness but also fullness of life. Even if the whole world would come to help us in our troubles, if we didn't have Christ we would be truly helpless. On the other hand, even if the whole world is against us and life is most miserable, and yet in Christ we know nothing can hinder His deliverance!

# Worship News

**On Palm Sunday, April 9<sup>th</sup>, there will only be ONE SERVICE at 10:00 am and SS/Bible Class at 9:00 am.** Everyone is invited to join us to celebrate the Confirmation and First Communion of Jeanette Gilson and Ana Mallie. A reception to honor the confirmands will be held immediately following the service.

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before He was crucified. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw palm branches in front of him as a sign of homage. This was customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

#### Maundy Thursday Communion Service April 13<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm

The Thursday before Easter, Maundy Thursday is observed in commemoration of the Last Supper of Christ with his disciples. The name Maundy is derived from the Latin *mandatum* (commandment) and refers to the new command that Jesus gives us in John 13:34.

## Good Friday Tenebrae Service April 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm

The Friday immediately preceding Easter, Good Friday is celebrated by Christians as the anniversary of Christ's crucifixion. Since the time of the early church, it has been a day of penance, prayer and fasting.

#### 500 YEARS OF REFORMATION AND IT IS STILL ALL ABOUT JESUS

Martin's parents soon realized they had a very smart boy. Plans were made to have him go to school. Most boys started school at age 6. Martin started at age 4. He attended Mansfield Latin School. A kind boy named Nick Oemler carried Martin to school on his shoulders. Years later Nick became a brother-in-law to Martin.

Martin's strict upbringing prepared him for even stricter teachers. Latin was the language used in school, church and business. Since there were few Books the lessons were spoken to the children by the teacher. Martin was a very good student. He enjoyed learning especially music. However, like any normal boy, he sometimes got into trouble Each week, on the last day of the week, the students would receive one punishment for each behavior. Martin



remembered very well the week he received 15 swats for his mistakes in one week.

In 1497 Martin's proud parents sent him to the Cathedral school of Mageleburg to become a lawyer. He went there for one year and then transferred to Eisenach to finish high school. His three years in St. George's school in Eisenach were his happiest. He lived with a family named Cotta and learned about happy family life. His teachers showed him respect instead of beatings. Martin never forgot the lessons he learned there.

With his academic success he was encouraged to go to University at Erfurt where he was awarded his Bachelor's degree. In spite of his academic success, Martin worried that he could never be good enough to be saved.

Martin went to Erfurt to study for his Masters degree. The more he studied and talked with teachers and fellow students, the more he was confused about his faith. After getting his Masters degree, he started his studies of law as his father had wished. After two months he quit and went home. His angry parents sent him back to Erfurt.

As Martin walked back to school a very great thunder storm came up. He took shelter under a tree. The lightening was so severe that he fell to the ground and prayed to St. Anne to save him and, if he was saved, he would become a monk. The storm passed. Martin was safe. He then proceeded to keep his promise and thought that if he lived a life in a monastery he would please God. Martin gave up his worldly goods and against all arguments of family and friends he entered the monastery of St. Augustine in Erfurt.
