God's peace and joy to you! Here is the big news item this morning as I wrote this article...

"Bones attributed to St Peter have been found by chance in a church in Rome during routine restoration work, 2,000 years after the apostle's death. The relics of the saint, who is regarded as the first Pope, were found in clay pots in the 1,000-year-old Church of Santa Maria in Cappella in the district of Trastevere, a medieval warren of cobbled lanes on the banks of the Tiber River. The bones were discovered when a worker lifted up a large marble slab near the medieval altar of the church, which has been closed to the public for 35 years because of structural problems."

The bones of St. Peter!! That's a big discovery, isn't it? It seems to be for the world. Personally, I'm not impressed. <u>IF</u> these really are his bones, what exactly does it mean for us? As far as I can tell, it means nothing. First off, there is no way to prove these bones are Peter's but even if I give the discoverers the benefit of the doubt it does not tell us anything other than Peter died – and I was already sure of that.

Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #9 – Readings

Today we come to the Scripture readings, and the beginning of the Service of the Word. This section of the service continues until the Service of the Sacrament (Holy Communion) begins. Here our soul is fed with the Spiritual meat that it needs in the readings and the sermon. The first liturgy note referred to the "Divine Service." The idea behind "Divine Service" is that God comes to bless us in worship. This is obviously true of the Scripture readings, but this can be said of all the liturgy which is drawn from Scripture. Take note of the '98 Hymn Supplement. It does a good job of referencing the Bible passages that the liturgy is drawn from. "The rhythm of our worship is from Him (God) to us, and then from us back to Him." (LW pg. 6). The entire liturgy follows this pattern. So while it may be obvious that God is speaking to us in the readings, the whole liturgy has already been informed by the Word of God. We speak back to Him what He has first spoken to us. He blesses us and we glorify Him.

The Readings along with the Introit and the Collect of the Day, are another proper of the day. Turn to page 10 of "Lutheran Worship" where the propers begin. Note at the top of page 11 there are a list of readings for that Sunday. A pastor may choose a one year series of readings that repeat each year or a three year cycle. The readings for both cycles follow the church year calendar—Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost. In addition to these readings, the Psalm of the Day and/or the Gradual is typically used in between the Old Testament and the Epistle Readings, and the Alleluia verse for the season may also be used prior to the Gospel reading. Each of these arelisted with the propers for the day as well. More will be said of the calendar later.

You will note that often the Old Testament reading corresponds to the Epistle or the Gospel reading in its content. This reminds us that Christianity is not a novel faith but rather it is rooted in the ancient promises of God recorded in the Old Testament. Jesus is thoroughly Jewish in his human family of origin. He has come in fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. It should be noted that the Gospel reading is treated with a special reverence since it is a record of the very words and deeds of Christ. The congregation stands for this reading, and in some congregations a special procession may be included in which the pastor and/or one or two assistants move to the center of the congregation with the processional cross and a copy of

the Lectionary or Bible. The appointed verses are then read in the midst of the people. These traditions serve as visual reminders that the Gospel records are the culmination of the Scriptures. The rest of the New Testament and the entire Old Testament center around who Jesus is and what He did for us as it is recorded in the Gospel records.

Consider incorporating these readings into your family's devotional time. Read the texts before the Sunday service so that you might be even more prepared to hear what will be expounded upon in the sermon.

500 Years of Reformation, 1517-2017 - AND IT IS STILL ALL ABOUT JESUS

Excerpts from "Martin Luther" a Student book for 7th and 8th graders. By Robert and Marian Baden, Concordia Publishing

To help explain the Bible and the message God had for believers, Luther wrote two books of questions and answers about Christian beliefs. The small catechism for new believers and the large catechism for teachers and pastors.

As reformation spread, other protestant groups arose that did not believe that Christ's body and blood were present during the sacrament. They believed it was only represented at the Lord's Supper. Those following Luther urged him to compromise but he heroically refused. Luther did so with insults and strong language that disappointed even his friends. Luther was not perfect. He was a hero of the faith...but also a sinner.

In later years, the Lutheran church took on new leadership and Luther had a smaller role in leading the church. He still remained active as a pastor but, at heart, Martin Luther was a parish pastor.

He and Katie opened their home to many seminary students. Often after dinner he talked with the students and they discussed all subjects of interest to them. Later the students gathered the notes from the informal sessions and published *Table Talk*, one of the most interesting collections of thoughts of a famous person that exists anywhere.

By 1537 Martin Luther began to feel his body failing and he knew his time was short. In 1542 Martin Luther suffered a personal tragedy in the death of his daughter Magdalena at the young age of 13. After this you could say he lost his enthusiasm. Luther's leadership role in the church declined.

However, he was known as a problem solver and in 1546 Luther was called to settle a dispute in Eisleben between the princes. Luther became ill during the trip but recovered and was successful. He preached four sermons and solved the problem between the princes.

As Martin Luther was traveling with his two sons and some friends, on February 17, 1546, he complained of chest pains and went to bed. Later one of his sons went to see him. Martin was gravely ill and knew, as did his sons, that death was near. Martin was asked, "Reverend Father, are you willing to die in the name of Christ and the doctrine which you preached?" Luther answered in a strong voice, "Yes". That was his last word. Martin Luther died February 18, 1546 in the town he was born.

Luther was an ordinary man whom God used to re-discover the truth that Jesus Christ lived and died for all people and gives salvation freely to all who accept His gift of faith. God can do much when He calls his people to live for Him.


Zone 7 is served by Bud and Lynn Hubert. This Zone has 15 families that live out of the Hampton Roads Area.

Church Council News

After receiving the approval from our Voters' Assembly on July 16th the Church Council met with the Board of Church Properties and accepted their recommendation to award the Sanctuary Air Conditioning contract to Cox-Powell. A meeting was held on September 1st with the Cox-Powell representative, Church Attorney – Howard Copeland, President – Conrad Greif, First Trustee – Errol Jennings, Recording Secretary – Lynn Hubert, and AC Team Leader – Bud Hubert. Thanks to Howard's legal assistance, the proposal was reviewed, corrections were made and the contract was signed. The first invoice of \$45,000 was paid to allow Cox-Powell to order the equipment needed. Cox-Powell began work on Monday, September 11th and plan to have the installation completed by Oct. 15th. Below is a copy of the letter from Attorney, Howard Copeland, which was sent to me following the meeting. A special thank you to all who brought was to this final step.

Re. Contract with Cox-Powell Corporation

Dear Conrad:

It was a professional pleasure and a spiritual inspiration to work as a team with you and Bud Hubert in reaching accord and execution of a contract with Cox-Powell Corporation for replacement of the environmental control system of our church.

While I deferred to Bud and you on the technical quality of the proposal from Cox-Powell, I was happy to provide legal analysis of the proposal of the preferred contractor. As you know, I found many provisions of the Cox-Powell proposal to be one-sided in giving legal protection to the contractor without reciprocal protection to the customer, Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. I thank you and Bud for the respect you bestowed on my legal judgment in the matter. While the Church might not have been harmed by those provisions, I found it to be unbalanced, exposing the Church to a great risk. It was my sense that a fair-minded and highly professional contractor would accept the logic of my argument, or, failing that, would have a financial incentive to accept my proposed revisions in order to land a nearly six figure contract, especially when they saw that we were united in our insistence on the changes, in the interest of fair play. I believe that the final draft that was signed by both parties was fair and minimized the exposure of our Church to liability or loss. Most important, I consider the executed contract to be fair to both parties!






