God's peace and joy to you...

Routine – a customary or regular course of action; commonplace tasks, chores or duties as must be done regularly; typical or everyday activity; regular, unvarying, habitual, unimaginative, or rote procedure.

There are a lot of people that think of routine as boring, as something to be avoided at all cost. Things that are routine are dull and tedious and mind-numbing. We want excitement. We want stimulation. As the lyrics to the Love Boat show used to say we want Exciting and New!

During the months of summer life tends toward routine. There may be a short break with a vacation but most of the summer is spent doing the same thing day after day. If you are an adult you get up, you go to work, you come home, maybe do a few chores and then go to bed. If you are a child you get up, you play all day, maybe you do a few chores and then go to bed. Not bad but even playing all day gets old after a while.

We might struggle with the same thing at church. The anticipation throughout the season of Advent and the festivity of Christmas is a distant memory. The somber tones and hymnody of Lent, the darkness of Holy Week and the glorious celebration of our Lord's Resurrection are also in the past. We have entered into the season of the Sundays after Pentecost.

One Sunday looks like another. There does not seem to be anything special. It is easy to become apathetic or indifferent. I hope to encourage you not to fall for that. The fact that one Sunday looks like another is a good thing. It is the evidence that God's Word and promise doesn't change with the seasons. He speaks His word of forgiveness into our ears, curing us of our sin-sick illness, giving us life.

As for there being nothing special, let me remind you of this – while it is true that God is always with us there are special Sundays when He is present for you here by His body and blood. On those days He gives you food that is truly 'soul food', forgiving you your sins and strengthening your faith. If you are not here to receive it, your soul goes hungry.

The fact is that I do not mind a little routine. It is something I can count on. It provides structure and gives me a sense of safety and security. Routine can be a good thing. Luke tells us that even Jesus had a routine: **And [Jesus] came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read.** You will not have to read in front of the synagogue but I pray that you include regular worship in your routine so that you can hear God's Word and receive the gifts He has for you.

Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #14 – The Prayers

The Apostle Paul wrote **I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone — for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.**

This passage gives the spirit of what the church has intended for the General Prayer also called The Prayer of the Church. This prayer is designed to **rise above small, local, and selfish considerations**. In other words, this is a time of prayer on behalf of the Church at large. To that end, many LCMS congregations today base their prayers on ones prepared by the Commission on Worship (LetUsPray). In this sense, the petitions truly are universal and prayed by the Church at Large.

It goes beyond praying only for the sick in the congregation. It is a broad ranging prayer that includes the great commission goal that the Word may be preached to the strengthening of God's people and salvation of the lost. Without careful consideration it is easy to let this prayer slip into becoming only a grocery list of parochial needs rather than breathing the spirit of Saint Paul's words above.

As far as its positioning in the worship service, the Prayer is closely tied with the offering and singing of the offertory. We offer up gifts, the praise of the offertory, and our prayers. More could be said in regard to its placement, but let me speak to another practical consideration. How do we stop our minds from wandering in prayer? It can be hard enough not to wander in our own prayer let alone following someone else's prayer! This is part of the reason the prayers are often broken up with words like **Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer**.

When I have followed another person who is leading a prayer, I have found it helpful to focus on a thought or phrase of the person's prayer and bring in my own quick petition on the subject. Perhaps I will repeat a phrase the other person is praying and give a quick **amen** or **Lord have mercy**. See what works for you, but don't let Satan and your flesh steal community prayer from you. Don't surrender so that you simply bow your head and let your mind drift. Join in and breathe the spirit of the Apostle Paul's words!

This course provides principles and tools for utilizing our God-given time, talents and treasure in ways that please God, proclaims our God and leads to financial peace. Some TLC members including Pastor Meraz and David Petri have participated in this course previously and highly recommend it.

The Executive Board of the LWML met in July to plan our next year of service. Sharon Knorr will be stepping down from her role as LWML President at the end of 2018. A very special thank you for her many years of service to the league. Cathy George has volunteered to serve in this position beginning in 2019. Officers for 2019 will be elected at our September meeting.

You are invited to join us! All women members of Trinity are considered LWML members. We do not pay dues, but we do collect mites from members. The mites are sent to the Zone and District to support their mission work. Mite Boxes are used to collect money for missions. Twenty-five percent of the mite offering is sent to LWML for mission grants and the remaining seventy-five percent is used for your district's mission grants. Mite money is used to further God's kingdom through the mission grants selected by delegates at district and national conventions. Place your Mite Box wherever you can feed it; dressing table, office desk, laundry room, car, kitchen counter, etc. Return your filled Mite Box to your LWML society. (Mite Boxes can be found in the Welcome Center.)

Each year Trinity sponsors a Seminary Student. We are currently sponsoring Terrell Davis (a past member of Trinity) while he attends the Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. If anyone in the congregation would like to contribute to Terrell please make your check out to Trinity and write in the memo "Seminary Student".

Ways to serve Trinity through the LWML –

Altar Guild – We are always looking for assistance to prepare our area of worship for service so please let us know if this is something you may be interested in.

Welcome Center – Hosts/hostesses are needed to provide refreshments during our fellowship gathering after Sunday morning church services. Please sign up for a Sunday on the Volunteer Board in the Welcome Center.

Prayer Shawl Ministry - We are always looking for those who know how to knit, crochet or work a loom. As the shawl is made, we ask that the preparer offers prayers to the Lord for the protection, comfort, and blessings for the shawl's recipient. The completed shawls are placed on the altar railing, the ladies then gather as a league and kneel at the altar and we pray that God would bless the shawl and its recipient. We pray that as the recipient wears the shawl, that they receive warmth and comfort from it, and that they feel the "hugs" from Trinity's LWML.

Pantry Fund - The LWML is the custodian of this account. The money for this fund comes through offering envelopes and through direct contributions. Money has been given to the Union Mission, the pantry at St. Timothy Lutheran Church, Hope Lutheran's Pantry and to help Special Ministries with their outreach programs to the homeless. This fund may also be used by the Pastor if he knows of someone who is in need of food.

Sanctuary Fund - This fund was turned over to the LWML to be its custodian because of the LWML Altar Guild which handles the upkeep of the altar needs (fair linen, purificators, communion wafers, wine and candle oil). Other expenditures include palms for Palm Sunday, the dry cleaning of stoles and paraments, and the purchase of baptismal napkins.

Laura Johnson Memorial Fund - The LWML is the custodian of this account. This fund provides for funeral receptions (at Church or in the home), flowers or other appropriate acknowledgements of care and concern. Members help to fund this account through memorials, "Blessings Received", and direct contributions.

As you can see all that we do cannot be accomplished by only one or two ladies. This takes all of the women of the LWML working together to the Glory of God. Please watch the bulletin for upcoming dates of meetings and happenings and please join us!

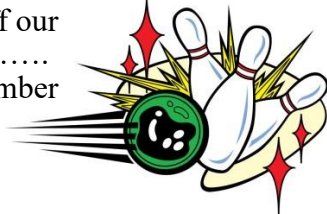
Your presence in the pew each Sunday inspires the deacons to continue in service to our Lord and Savior.

Below is a list of a few items suggested by *Operation Christmas Child*:

Comb, hairbrush, toothbrush, washcloth, adhesive bandages, reusable plastic containers full of hair bows or bracelets, socks, mittens, pencils, pencil sharpener, colored pencils, pencil case, pens, crayons, makers, coloring pad or notebooks that will fit into a shoebox, foam ball, small doll, finger puppets, slinky, cars, plastic tools, plastic cookware. One "WOW" item is suggested and is usually a small stuffed animal. All items should be new and in good condition.

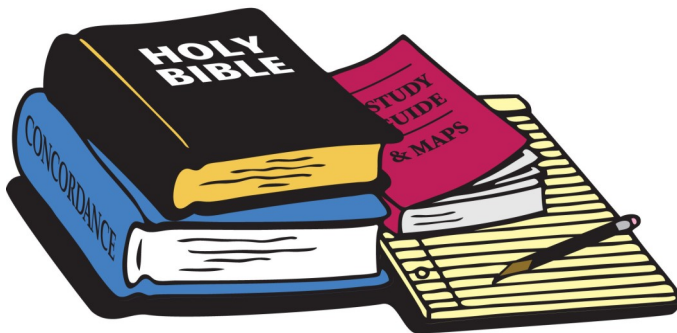
