Pastor's recommended reading ...

The Case for Faith Lee Strobel

Lee Strobel has a journalism degree from University of Missouri and a Master of Studies in Law degree from Yale Law School. He went into investigative journalism working for the Chicago Tribune. Strobel began investigating the Biblical claims about Christ after his wife's conversion. Although he was an avowed skeptic and an atheist his investigation ultimately resulted in his conversion becoming a Christian. You can read about that in his first book -A Case for Christ.

This book is part of his now 20 some books on 'making a case'. He uses the investigative procedures learned earning his law degree trying to maintain an objectivity that would hold up in a court of law. That is what makes his books interesting to me.

In this book Strobel addresses some of the questions that plague non-believer and believer alike. Chapters such as Since Evil and Suffering Exist, A Loving God Cannot; A Loving God Would Never Torture People in Hell; and Evolution Explains Life, So God Isn't Needed go through a step by step process tackling the arguments against faith with a lawyer's skill.

Strobel's writing style is very comfortable and easy to understand. One cannot argue a person into faith. That gift comes from the Holy Spirit but I think the Spirit uses messages such as the ones in this book for His purposes. I encourage you to give it a read. It may help with some of the doubts and difficulties that you are dealing with, ones that we all have.

Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #17 – Sanctus

The Sanctus is a rich burst of praise sung before the Lord's Supper continuing the Proper Preface which concluded with the words *Therefore with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven we laud and magnify your glorious name, evermore praising you and saying*: With that introduction, the Sanctus begins with the cherubim's praise found in Isaiah 6:3: Holy, holy, holy is the Lord, God of pow'r and might: Heaven and earth are full of your glory...

The church may be separated by geography, language, false doctrine, time, death, etc. but we are in reality one body in Christ. In regard to the Lord's Supper Paul says **Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.** Thus, we sing the angel's praise. We join with the angels and the whole church, for together we are one church. Outwardly we are divided but in Christ we are one body.

The Sanctus continues with the Benedictus that says *Hosanna*, *Hosanna* in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. These words are drawn from Psalm 118:25-26 and Matthew 21:9. Hosanna means *save now* and became an expression of praise. Historically, it was customary for the Jewish Passover to end with the singing of Psalms 115-118.

The Gospel of Mark tells us that Jesus and His disciples concluded the Passover/first Communion by singing a hymn. Most likely Jesus sang Psalm 118 that included the words of our Sanctus. These are the same words that the crowds greeted Jesus with as He triumphantly entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. They are the words used to greet the promised Messiah.

It is no accident that this triumphant greeting is combined with the words of praise heard in the heavenly throne room. The combination of the holy, holy, holy and the same words that the crowds greeted Jesus with on Palm Sunday serves as a confession that this Jesus who now comes to us in, with and under the bread and wine is the Triune God who Isaiah saw in the heavenly throne room.

Theologically, the last phrase of the Sanctus points us to the elements in Communion. Our *Hosanna...Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord* finds its fulfillment in the reception of the Sacrament. Under the masks of bread and wine, Jesus comes to us and gives us His very own body and blood for our forgiveness. Interestingly, Reformed churches removed this portion of the Sanctus for the very reason that they deny the truth of Jesus' words when He said **this is my body, this is my blood**.

A special thank you to all who donated diapers for the Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank! We collected a total of **369 individual diapers** from newborn to adults. Making a difference by keeping the babies and adults, clean, dry and healthy. This daily necessity is so vital.

We submitted our application to ODU to become a recognized organization and our application was found incomplete as we need one more student (their website said two but the application required three to be listed as president, spokesperson and treasurer). We are reaching out on campus and to other LCMS churches throughout the district. If you know anyone that knows of an ODU student who would like to help us in getting the Campus Ministry started please share their name with us. Remember it can be an adult taking classes too. Jim Hoeft is still leading this effort. We pray a student will step forward, so we can move ahead with the application process. So again, stay tuned....

The sandwich making for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries on Lafayette Boulevard may move into February as January is ending. This will be done after church. **Date to be announced**. Please watch the bulletin and Facebook for the date. It is such a rewarding project to help our neighbors in need.

We are volunteering at the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia on Saturday, February 9, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. This is always a fun morning of sorting or packing. Remember to wear closed toe shoes. You can register on-line with the Foodbank prior to going in February to make things go faster the morning we volunteer. Those of you who have already volunteered should have a login to sign-up. We are committed to ten volunteers. Please sign-up on the special ministry board so I can give them a count the week before we go.

During Lent we will be collecting items for Lutheran World Relief for the **Baskets of Promise -Personal** Care Kits. There will be a collection bin in the welcome center to deposit the items during Lent.

Each kit contains:

- 1 x lightweight bath towel, dark color recommended (between 20" x 40" & 52" x 27")
- 2 x bath size bars of gentle soap (in original wrapper)
- 1 x toothbrush (in original wrapper)
- 1 x sturdy comb
- 1 x metal nail clippers (attached file optional)

We will pack the kits after Easter and have them delivered to the Lutheran World Relief distribution center in Maryland. Join us in this opportunity to make an impact in the lives of poor and struggling families around the world.

We would like to have a Trinity team at the "Walk for LIFE" at the Virginia Zoo in Norfolk on Saturday, April 13, 2019. Very soon The Friends of Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater will have registration open (visit www.cpcfriends.org/walk) and get ready to start raising funds. This is a walk-athon where you would get pledges from your friends and family with money going to the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater.

Here is a little background: the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater is a Christ-centered organization with a calling to reach out to women and families involved in crisis-related pregnancies by offering real help for the present, hope for the future, and healing from the past.

In 2015, there were 5,204 abortions in the Hampton Roads area. This means for every three babies born, one will lose its life to abortion. More lives are lost to abortion than any other cause of death.

CPC exists to save lives, spare hearts and further the gospel of Jesus Christ. We want our clients to know we genuinely care and have no financial gain from their pregnancy decision. They raise all financial support for their ministry through private funding.

The things that are always occurring are collection of children's books, hotel soap/shampoos, old batteries, eye glasses and postage stamps for prison Bible ministry. Collection bin for these items are in the Welcome Center.



Wirtz, a former Navy SEAL working for the Defense Intelligence Agency. The department did not identify the fourth American killed, a civilian contractor who officials said served as an interpreter.


