Grace and peace to you...

It's actually the middle of March as I am writing this but I have already had to mow my lawn. I am not complaining. While I was mowing, the western part of the US was being struck with an incredible blizzard. The small town in Nebraska, where I served, avoided the snow but precipitation came in the form of rain. I saw pictures and videos of over a foot of water streaming down the highway that runs through town about 200 feet from the parsonage. All this to say that I am thankful that we are here.

Most of April and May have us in the season of Easter, a season of celebration and joy that, in my opinion, exceeds Christmas. Having come through the somber, reflective season of Lent, Easter feels like being released from prison. In reality, I think that is a pretty good analogy.

During Epiphany we heard that Jesus revealed Himself in His hometown of Nazareth. Reading from the book of Isaiah at Sabbath worship He said **The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor.** He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.

The hearers waited expectantly for Him to expound on this scripture. Jesus simply said today this word has come true in your hearing. You might remember this did not go over very well. The old friends and neighbors from His hometown drug Him out of town to a hill intending to kill Him but it was not the right time... yet.

Later He would end up on a hill at the right time, not outside of Nazareth but outside of Jerusalem. There He would willingly give up His life for those who were in the prison of sin and death. I am talking about you and me. Because of Jesus we are no longer in prison. We have been set free. Our spiritual blindness has been healed.

While it happens all year around, Easter is a particularly wonderful time to **proclaim the year of the Lord's favor**, first to ourselves and one another and then to a world that is still imprisoned. Enjoy the freedom. Enjoy the peace and the comfort and the joy. And where God gives you opportunity to **proclaim good news** do so with absolute confidence for He is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!

Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #18 – Pre-Communion Prayer and Lord's Prayer

The prayer before Communion (LSB pp. 161/178 and 209) is part of the preparation for Communion. It continues in the spirit of thanksgiving that started with the Preface. The prayer also points us away from ourselves and places the emphasis on God who is the host at the Lord's Supper. We bring the wine, bread, and set up the altar but God is the one doing the feeding.

The Pre-Communion Prayer also teaches us. Read the words carefully for yourself. It teaches us that God has had mercy on us in Christ. It teaches us that we can't save ourselves but have redemption in Jesus. It teaches us that God Himself has gathered us and all Christians from the ends of the earth to this meal, which is the unending marriage feast of the Lamb. It teaches us that, though we were barred from the tree of life in the Garden of Eden, God has planted a new tree at Calvary; in the Lord's Supper, we take and eat the fruits of the tree of life and live forever.

In connection to the Lord's Supper we speak the Lord's Prayer. Note the fifth petition - ...and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive... Having prayed for forgiveness, we receive it by faith as the body & blood is given to us under the bread and the wine. Thus, in Communion, God gives us a resounding and immediate yes to our request.

These notes were originally written in 2001 by Pastor David Oberdieck and have been edited.

CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTER OF TIDEWATER'S

In 2017, the organization is credited with saving 686 lives through intervention. Consider the following from CPC:

Crisis:

For every 3 babies born in South Hampton Roads, 1 will lose his or her life to abortion In 2017, there were 5,108 abortions in South Hampton Roads

Solution:

CPC handled 6,081 calls from women in crisis

CPC administered 1,755 pregnancy tests and performed 767 life-revealing ultrasounds at no cost to our patients 686 lives were spared from abortion (these are the ones we know of, there are many more, but we don't hear back from all our patients)

57 people made a commitment to Jesus Christ

Vision:

We would like to raise funds to keep our call center open on some evenings and Saturdays We would like to grow our discipleship parenting classes for our patients and their families We would like to increase our online advertising presence in order to reach more women

The first person who donates to a fund-raising walker is admitted to the Zoo for free and if you bring a guest (who is not a fund-raising walker), CPC is offering a discounted rate of \$8 per person at the door to cover their admission fee to The Virginia Zoo. Children age 2 and under are free.

"Blessed shall you be in the city, and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you come in, and blessed shall you be when you go out" (Deut 28:3-6).

This is God's promise to the Israelites as they stood beyond the Jordan outside of the Promised Land. He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make their fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground or their wombs, their flocks or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether upon their coming in or their going out.

But there's a catch. He would do this for Israel only "if you obey the voice of the Lord your God". If they did that, He would cause that "all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you" (Deut 28:2).

If they did not obey the voice of the Lord, if they did not keep the commandments of the Lord and walk in His ways (Deut 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh. He fulfilled the law for us — in our place and for our benefit; died for us — in our place and for our benefit; and is risen from the dead for us — in our place and for our benefit.

By this we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous. The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. It depends upon His work and not ours.

All this is ours in Holy Baptism. For in Holy Baptism, God claims us as His own, makes us His children, His heirs, His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is pressed into His service, and thereby it becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is not in order to receive blessings but because in Christ we already have. It is with this in mind that we sit down on the first day of the week and set aside as He has prospered us to give to His church for His work of blessing in our midst (1 Cor. 16:2).

Trinity's 100th Anniversary Celebration begins in 2020

Shortly after the end of World War I several Lutheran families arranged to meet weekly for worship services in Williams Funeral Home in Norfolk. On May 30, 1920 the church was organized by 10 men signing the original constitution (no voting rights for the congregation's women in those days). Since that day also happened to be Trinity Sunday in the church calendar, Trinity became the name of the congregation. On December 20th, Rev. Frederick Meuschke was installed as our first pastor.

Trinity has seen lots of history since that beginning. We have truly been blessed with many families who have called Trinity their church home. If you have names and addresses of any past members who may have moved away or moved to another church family for whatever reason, please share their info with us so that we can invite them back to celebrate with us sometime in our yearlong celebration.

As of this writing we have received \$15,017.71 in donations from 20 families toward the 100th Anniversary celebration. Thank you!

Pastor's recommended reading ...

Which None Can Shut by Reema Goode

Remarkable True Stories of God's Miraculous Work in the Muslim World.

"Imagine a place where becoming a Christian is a punishable crime - and your own family exacts the punishment. Where those who spread the Gospel among locals are deported if discovered. Where converts to Christianity face persecution, isolation, or even death as the price for their faith."

Thus begins the description of a young woman and her family who work secretly as missionaries in a closed Middle Eastern country. Having parents who worked in the mission field in Sierra Leone, Africa myself I am fascinated by the experiences of people in mission work. As my mother told me, some experiences are terrifying, others are incredibly joyful but there's never a dull moment. Reading the true accounts of how God does His work, sometimes in miraculous ways, is encouraging to me. This is what this book is about. Reema's narrative runs the spectrum from fear and disappointment to extreme excitement and joy.

The book is a very easy read. The accounts are often touching, sometimes humorous, occasionally heartbreaking but definitely inspiring. It might even give your faith a boost as you see how God continues to do His work of conversion throughout the world. As always if you decide to read it I would love to discuss it with you afterward, if you so choose.
