Introduction to the Divine Service

Notes on the Liturgy #19 – Communion and the Peace

Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper the night He was betrayed. The Lord's Supper is the *blood of the covenant*. It is Jesus' promise and assurance to us that we are partakers of His grace. Each time it is offered the pastor reads the words of institution. In these words Jesus speaks to us and informs us that we are receiving His body and blood in the bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sin. Different churches have different customs how often the Lord's Supper is offered. The early church celebrated it every Sunday. Communion was the center of worship for they understood the church is bound together in one body as we all partake of the one loaf (I Corinthians 10:17).

Communion's first purpose is a meal of forgiveness. God is doing this for us. The above verse also shows us that it is a meal of unity. Thus the things that strike against unity of the church also strike against the purpose of the Lord's Supper. If we needlessly, sinfully stir up dissension in the church among Christian brothers and sisters we are actually sinning against the body and blood of Christ. Even more importantly, when someone holds to false doctrine or unites themselves with a church body that teaches error this too works against one of the purposes of the Lord's Supper. For this reason we practice close Communion.

After the words of institution, the pastor gives the Peace: *The peace of the Lord be with you always*. Some pastors may have the custom of raising the elements up into the air to clearly show that our peace with God comes through Christ's work and Christ's meal. The people of God respond with the simple confession *Amen. Yes, yes, it shall be so*—this meal does indeed bring this promised peace.

5 Things You Can Do To Make Your Congregation A Caring Church Paul J. Cain

We (Trinity) have recently purchased the **You Can Do It! Series** from CPH. This series of 9 books is described by CPH this way: The You Can Do It! series encourages and equips believers to live out life as disciples of Jesus Christ, being formed and shaped by God's Word. Written in a clear and encouraging style, each of these topical books gives Christians achievable goals for strengthening their faith and relationships. Each book features a consistent presentation of a topic in five parts with each part consisting of a presentation, a summary, discussion questions, and several action steps.

I want to say right away that as a God-fearing, believing Lutheran I have a tendency to run away from anything that looks like works righteousness. My faith is in the work of Jesus Christ alone. I am also certain that we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do (Ephesians 2:10).

God has prepared 'stuff' for us to do. I think if you take on this book series with the understanding that this is God's work through the Spirit then there are some valuable ideas and practices that will help you spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all the people in your particular environment.

The nine titles all begin with 5 Things You Can Do To... The subjects include Understand the Bible Better, Witness Christ, Make Your Marriage Stronger, Read the Bible Prayerfully, Have a Faithful Prayer Life, Appreciate Science and Love the Bible, Have a Stronger Family, Live a Jesus-Centered Life and the first book that I am recommending Make Your Congregation a Caring Church.

We are already a caring church but that should not stop us from always trying to improve in that area. This book gives many helpful tips about caring for each other, for the community and for the visitor who walks in the door. The book is a very easy read that could be finished in a couple of hours, if you wanted to. I will encourage everyone to read it but it is especially appropriate for those who serve our Trinity family.

Over the next few newsletters I will begin to recommend others from this series but please feel free to read any of them before that.

Team Trinity participated in the "Walk for LIFE" at the Virginia Zoo in Norfolk on Saturday, April 13, 2019 to benefit the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater. Thank you to James Hoeft for getting the team shirts for everyone! We had several different people tell us how nice it was to see the matching shirts. The morning looked like it was going to be a washout but after some rain the sun came out and we were able to do the walk and stay dry.

Those who wanted to stay after and look around the zoo were able to do that also. There was one woman that raised, on her own, over \$27,000 for the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater. We even heard from a few women who once they heard the heartbeat of their child decided abortion was not the answer for them. They have beautiful little babies that were also there.

So, all the above made for a busy spring and summer is looking to be busy too!

The prices there are reasonable, and you might even find something for yourself to read. Lets fill the bookshelf for the third time!

Blessings and Challenges

Trinity is a blessing to us, its members in the body of Christ, to our community and to the world through support of LCMS ministries. We are looking forward to Trinity's celebration in 2020 of 100 years of God's grace. It is a blessing that giving to the General Fund (budget) increased in 2018 compared to 2017. Giving to the General Fund (budget) in the first four months of 2019 was greater than the same period in 2018. So, praise God from whom all blessings flow.

The challenge is that our tightly controlled budget expenses still exceeded giving to the budget by \$5000 or approximately \$300 per week in those first four months of 2019. Our May deficit ended up to be \$10,499.60. We also know that giving trends lower during May through September compared to other months. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will encourage our membership to maintain their level of giving through the coming summer months.

One reason giving drops off during summer months is that most members give when they attend. They typically miss more frequently in the summer and do not catch up for the missed Sundays. One option to keep your giving consistent is to enroll in the Thrivent sponsored "Simply Giving" program. You select the donation, the day and the frequency of the donation and the money is withdrawn from your bank account. Forms are available on the bulletin board in the office hallway. A voided check is required. Completed forms should be given to Anne Combes, Church Secretary. Anne can also answer any questions.


Deacons


