Governor Northam's new Executive Order Fifty-Three goes into effect from March 24th at 11:59 pm until Thursday, April 23rd at 11:59 pm. It states Virginians are strongly encouraged to seek alternative means of attending religious services, such as virtually or via "drive-through" worship. Places of worship that do conduct in person services must limit gatherings to 10 people, to comply with the statewide 10-person ban.

With this order in effect it is with great sadness that the Executive Board along with Pastor have agreed that all services and activities are canceled until the end of April, at which time we pray the order is lifted and we can go back to some sense of normal.



The 100th Anniversary Calendar is still available in the Welcome Center. If you did not receive a copy, the calendar can also be found on Trinity's website under the 100th Anniversary tab.

Our Anniversary Worship Service (10:00 am) and Banquet (5:30 pm) at Grand Affairs are still planned for June 7th. We will gladly accept reservations now and payment later due to our current situation. As of March 22, 2020, we have received \$26,911.71 in donations to our 100th Anniversary Fund. Leaving \$22,503.46 which will be used to cover our yearlong celebration and projects around Trinity (to be determined). Thank you to everyone who have made contributions to this fund. We will be accepting donations thru 2020.

Board of Stewardship

The following article was copied from the LCMS website -

On the topic of stewardship, one of the most common questions a person might ask is *not* whether a Christian should give to their church. Everyone knows this. Of course, Christians should give to their church.

The most common question: "How much should I give?" But what they really mean is this: "Should Christians give a tithe of their income to their local congregation?" So, let's look at why you should or should not tithe.

Following are some reasons often offered for why Christians *shouldn't* give a tithe to their church.

Some say you shouldn't tithe because it isn't expressly commanded in the New Testament. Lacking that command, there is no "Thus saith the Lord" and no "should" for giving a tithe to your congregation.

Others say that Christians give to their congregation in ways much broader than money. They give of their time and their talents, and these, together with treasures (money), add up to more than a tithe.

Still others say they give of their treasures to other things besides their congregation, and they want to support those things alongside their church.

And there are those who think Christians shouldn't tithe because of fear. If they tithe, they are afraid their gift will be misused, and they are afraid they won't have enough to get the things they use, want, or need.

Following are some reasons for why Christians *should* give a tithe to their church.

Even though the New Testament doesn't specifically command Christians to give a tithe, the Old Testament people were commanded to tithe and did. On top of this, St. Paul often describes the giving Christians are to do in similar terms as a tithe: a regular and generous proportion of the first fruits of their income (1 Cor. 6:1–2; 2 Cor. 8:7–23; 2 Cor. 9:2–7).

But here's another way to think about it. What was the point of the tithe in the Old Testament? Where did it go? The reason for the Old Testament tithe was to support the full ministry of the Levites. They were not given any land because they had no time to farm; their full-time job was the ministry.

What does it say in the New Testament? "The Lord has commanded that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel" (1 Cor. 9:14). This is the verse that Luther put in the *Small Catechism*'s Table of Duties to cover what Christians owe to the support of the ministry.

It seems clear from both the Old and the New Testaments that the tithe is the goal of Christians in their giving. But what if we're not there yet? How should we handle this? What are we to do?

Let's answer this by asking a different question about something entirely different. What would you say to your adult children who only attended church quarterly or once a month? There, is after all, no passage in the New Testament that requires Christians to go to church weekly. Hebrews 10:25 is the closest we have, and it states simply for Christians to not neglect gathering together. Even though there is no passage that commands Christians to gather weekly, that is the implicit expectation throughout the Old and New Testaments. It is the goal.

So, what would you say to that son or daughter? I'd expect that conversation would be something like this: "I'm glad you're still going to church. It is a wonderful blessing to hear God's promises of forgiveness, life, and salvation, and to receive His gifts in the Word and the Sacraments. But you can do better, and it will only be a blessing to you. There is a better way, and I'd really like you to try to attain it."

This same conversation is how we should approach the topic of the tithe. It's not specifically commanded in the New Testament, but it sure seems like the implicit expectation of both the Old and New Testaments. So, the church is ecstatic that you're giving when you're giving in all these ways – time, talents, and treasures.

The Board of Stewardship met via conference call to discuss the current state of financial affairs for TLC in the midst of the COVID-19 crisis. While not the ideal financial situation, we are doing our best to maximize our revenues and minimize our expenses. With respect to revenues, thanks to Pastor's email and members mailing in their offerings, we are doing "okay". As for expenses, we continue to pay our bills and maintain the payroll. The true end of month status will be provided next week by the Treasurer. The board will meet late April to do another assessment and update the council.

Our two saving graces are we still have \$43,000 that can be used for deficit reduction at the end of the year as well as a very solid congregation.

A very special thank you to those who have been able to continue their offerings to Trinity. If you are financially able to do so there are many ways to get your offerings to us: by mail, drop it off at church (there is a locked black mailbox by the parking lot doors), or electronically (a VANCO form has been included in this newsletter if you would like to enroll - just complete and return to church with a voided check).

The Book Your Pastor WISHES YOU WOULD READ (but is too embarrassed to ask)

This book was recommended to me by a friend who is also a pastor. The title caught my attention and I ordered a copy. I was curious about the perspective the book would have because, in effect, it tells a church how to care for their pastor. That sounds selfish. We usually think of needs in monetary or physically supportive characteristics. I don't feel a lack in those needs. I believe the Trinity family cares for me and my wife very well that way. But that's not the kind of care this book is addressing.

This book discusses a much broader spectrum. How does a pastor get or feel encouraged? Is there anything to be done to keep a pastor from 'burning out'? What can members do that brings a pastor joy which is worth far more than silver or gold? That's what this book is about. And the odd thing is that those things that bring the pastor joy also build up the individual in their faith resulting in a stronger church body. That's the way the Spirit works.

Here are a couple of the chapter titles: Daily Repentance and Eager Faith, Open Honesty, Loving Kindness, Zealous Submission. As one reviewer put it the book is full of biblical wisdom and practical counsel about how church members and pastors should relate to and encourage one another as together they grow in Christ.

This book says things that I personally am not always good at or comfortable with saying out loud but they are said well by Mr. Ash. The book is a quick read and I hope you take the time to read it. When you do, feel free to give me your insight or opinion and come discuss it with me. There is no other book I know of like it.

The bookshelf in the Welcome Center was full again so we contacted REACH (Reading Enriches All Children) for them to come out and gather the books. Over 300 books were collected this time. Keep the books coming as each book helps a child in our community build a life-long skill/love of reading!

Last year we ended with a bang! With your help we packed shoeboxes for "Operation Christmas Child" and collected diapers for the Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank. We made an impact locally and globally all from Norfolk, Virginia - how AWESOME is that!

In February, 122 hospitality care kits were made one Sunday and the following Sunday we made 228 sandwiches and donated 192 protein bars. All of this was delivered to *St. Columba* Ecumenical Ministries, Inc. in Norfolk by Linda and Mark Loper and Jo-Nell and David Chadwick.

Thank you to everyone who donated items for the hospitality care kits. Remember when you travel bring those hotel samples back and deposit them in the bins in the Welcome Center. We were able to do the sandwiches with seed money from Thrivent. St. Columba was so happy to receive all the items donated by the members of Trinity.

A BIG thank you to everyone who stayed one or two Sundays to help in these worthwhile projects making a difference in the community in which we live! Projects like these are not possible without your support. It was great seeing different faces helping from children to seniors and everyone in between let me say thank you, we could not have done it without each and every one of you!

A few members of the Special Ministry Board met after church one week and planned out our activities for 2020. The pandemic is not helping us much in getting started We were going to volunteer at the Foodbank of Southern Virginia on March 28th, but it was cancelled since social distancing is the "new norm".

Our second project was to make "CRAM BAGS" for final week for students attending ODU through our **LCMS U outreach**. With ODU going to on-line only classes for the remainder of the semester because of the pandemic this too has been scrapped.

On April 26th we were going to make sandwiches for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries, Inc. and you guessed it this will not be happening unless things change soon. We will also be making sandwiches on August 16th after church.

We have a full calendar with Foodbank dates on July 25th and October 17th. Both are Saturdays and we are signed up for 10 people for quality assurance. Please mark your calendar and hopefully, we will be back to normal by then and will be able to volunteer.

We will be collecting for "Sleepers in September" as part of a nationwide push to supply warm sleepers and pajamas to needy babies across the U.S. We will be donating thorough the Hampton Roads chapter of Newborns in Need.

Old batteries will NO LONGER BE COLLECT-ED. Other ongoing collections of hotel soap/shampoos, eye glasses and postage stamps for prison bible ministry. Collection bins for these items are in the Welcome Center. Help us to reduce our carbon footprint!

If you are interested in helping us find organizations and individuals that need our help, consider joining Special Ministries. There is so much to do and many hands make for light work. None of what we do would be possible without the help of each member of the congregation and we THANK YOU! May God continue to bless Trinity as they make a difference in the world!

With all that is going on in the world and changing minute by minute, I would love to see everyone write thank you notes to nurses, doctors, and first responders. I will see that the notes get to them. A kind note, some encouragement, love and kindness will brighten their day in these difficult times.
