From Our Pastor

God bless you with peace and joy... *Normal - conforming to the standard or the common type; usual; not abnormal; regular; natural*. This is the definition of normal according to Dictionary.com. It looks like we're returning to normal, to the way things used to be before we were so rudely interrupted by that pandemic thing. That means we have to recall exactly what normal looked like.

This past Sunday saw the return of the procession to open our worship service. The acolytes, communion assistant, and I had to jog memories and remember just what we used to do. The Gospel was walked out among the people. The offering plate made its return as a part of the service. We closed with a recession of the cross and our 100th Anniversary banner to end the service. We still wear face masks but total normality looks like it's just on the horizon and we'll have 'business as usual' and everything will be the way it was... only we won't have 'business as usual' and it won't be the way it was.

The events of the past year have affected us in many ways. The separation and the isolation have changed the way people interact throughout the world. The anxiety (and, yes, the fear) that was created with the pandemic distressed us and disturbed us in ways we may never totally be aware of. Many relationships were significantly changed, some for good and some not so good. All of this is the natural result of the passage of time and the events that occur within time. Thomas Wolfe said it well - *you can't go home again*. You can't truly go back to a place (*or a time*) you once lived because so much will have changed since you left that place (*or time*) that it isn't the same place (*or time*) anymore (*inserted italics are mine*).

So, does this mean we've lost everything? Does it leave us in a state of hopelessness? Are we doomed to depression and despair? Those of us who have lived a little while know that the fact that things change is an unchangeable fact. We also know that as we remember what we had and are thankful for it, things to come may bring us even greater joy. Worshiping with one another postpandemic in person is bringing me a newly invigorated joy and encouragement. I love hearing your voices singing. I'm thankful God has seen us through a difficult time. I'm thankful for the perseverance shown by all of you throughout the past 15 months. As God says through James: **Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him. Your strength strengthened me.**


Kendyll Joy Gunther graduated from Blue Ridge Mountain College. She is the granddaughter of Charlotte Gunther.
