Thank you to everyone who came out and made sandwiches for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries after church. We distributed the sandwiches along with socks and underwear. Two of the things that are needed most for the homeless. Many hands made for light work! It was also great to be back together working in person on a project!!! A big thank you to Jo-Nell and David Chadwick for getting the supplies for this ministry. The Chadwick's also applied for a Thrivent Action Team card which we used to purchase the supplies. Thank you to Thrivent for seeing the value in helping those less fortunate.

We will be making sandwiches again in the near future. It will be after church so keep an eye on the bulletin. This ministry of making sandwiches for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries replaces us cooking at the Judeo-Christian Outreach center. The needs there have changed and the numbers have come down as a new shelter opened and many of those we served have moved on. The sandwiches reach many more people and we will be putting together hospitality kits to go with the sandwiches. This will occur several times a year where JCOC was just twice a year.

The month of May we will be collecting food for the Food Bank of Southeastern Virginia. Collected items may be placed on the pew inside the parking lot doors. The need is great with more people having to turn to the Food Bank each and every day. We help our fellow community members in their time of need. One never knows when it could be you reaching out for assistance. This ministry is so vital in our community and always has a big response.

Remember the Food Bank does **NOT** take food with an expiration date over six months old. So keep that in mind as you clean out your cabinets or purchase food.

We are looking at ways to help refugees but do not have a handle on this ever changing crisis. Stay tuned for more on that...

Did you know that Special Ministries collects items all year round?

In our quest to lower our carbon footprint and to help others in our community, we are always collecting for –

REACH (Reading Enriches All Children) – **Our Mission: LITERACY.** *REACH, Inc. promotes literacy for children throughout Coastal Virginia through access and ownership of books.* At Trinity we collect gently loved or new books throughout the year. Please keep the books coming as each book helps a child in our community build a life-long skill/love of reading!

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL - Recycle Usable Eyeglasses Give New Life. Refractive errors can be easily corrected with eyeglasses, yet millions living in low and middle income countries lack access to basic eye care services. Lions have recognized the urgent need for corrective lenses and collect usable glasses in their communities to support the Lions Recycle For Sight Program.

THE GREATER HAMPTON ROADS DIAPER BANK - Did you know that 1 in 3 families don't have access to an adequate supply of diapers? The Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank recognized this need and has been working since 2012 to change the lives of babies, children with disabilities, and seniors in the Greater Hampton Roads Area. At Trinity we collect all sizes of diapers, all year long and they are donated when the bin is FULL.

USED PRINTER INK AND TONER CARTRIDGES – We collect those for reward points at *OF-FICEDEPOT*. This helps use in purchasing paper for our Sunday bulletins!

TOILETRY ITEMS – When you are traveling and stop in a hotel, remember to bring back those little bottles. We use them to make hospitality bags for the homeless.

POSTAGE STAMPS FOR MISSIONS – "The most interesting thing about a postage stamp is the persistence with which it sticks to its job." (Napoleon Hill, www.brainyquote.com/topics/stamp) These stamps make sure we get letters, cards, bills, etc. but also have a 2-fold purpose (persistence). They are used again to raise funds to purchase Bibles for 3rd world countries, prison ministries and other organizations that need Bibles.

REDUCE, **REUSE**, **RECYCLE** – Since our local Ronald McDonald House is no longer accepting *PopTops*, Special Ministries is asking that you recycle the whole aluminum can! Whatever type of top you were popping, please bring the whole item in for recycling. Bill Sontag has set up a large grey trash can behind the shed so that you can conveniently deposit your items when coming to Church. Monies collected from this recycling effort will be used to help with building maintenance/beautification around Trinity.

Blessed Shall You Be

"Blessed shall you be in the city, and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you come in, and blessed shall you be when you go out." (Deuteronomy 28:3-6)

This is God's promise to the Israelites as they stood beyond the Jordan outside of the Promised Land. He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make their fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground, their wombs, their flocks, or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether upon their coming in or their going out.

But there's a catch. He would do this for Israel only "if you obey the voice of the LORD your God." (Deut. 28:2b) If they did that, He would cause that "all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you." (Deut. 28:2a). If they didn't obey the voice of the Lord, if they didn't keep the commandments of the Lord and "walk in his ways" (Deut. 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh and fulfilled the law for us – in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ died for us – in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ is risen from the dead for us – in our place and for our benefit. By this we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous. The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. It depends upon his work, not ours.

All this is ours in Holy Baptism. For in Holy Baptism, God claims us as His own, makes us His children, His heirs, and His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is pressed into His service, and it thereby becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve, and obey Him. This is not in order to receive the blessings but because in Christ we already have. With this in mind, we sit down on the first day of the week and set aside as He has prospered us to give to His church for His work of blessing in our midst (1 Corinthians 16:2).

Greetings and Happy Spring everyone!

LWML had a planning meeting on March 12th. We had 10 members that attended and 2 were first timers! Just a reminder - ALL ladies are members of Trinity LWML and all of you are welcome to attend.

2022 is the 80th anniversary of the LWML. All LWML groups are celebrating around the world by participating in "What's your 80? " Trinity has already started this challenge in December 2021 with the Military Cookie pack. Our goal was 80 packs. We made 130+ packs. We are over achievers!

At our meeting on March 12th we decided to continue working on the challenge by focusing on Mites. Our goal is to collect \$80.00 each quarter. We plan to have a Mite Sunday in June as our first quarter for the year. We will have a Mite Sunday again in September followed by another one in December – collecting \$80.00+ each time. Look for more information to come.

Also, we will be collecting men's socks (with a goal of 80 pairs) to be collected by December. We will then give our collection to St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries in Norfolk with the focus being to give aid to men.

There is one more project planned for September. Details to come.

LWML TRINITY ARTS and CRAFTS FAIR! In 2020 LWML had planned on having an Arts and Crafts Fair. We had started listing what we needed to do and how to organize it all but it never came to be due to the pandemic. We are asking that the congregation help us with this project. A planning meeting has been scheduled for Saturday, May 7th at 10 am in Belvedere Hall. Please pray that many will consider helping with this project. We also discussed our Mission projects. We made \$1300.00 for Missions this past year. We voted to send \$500.00 to LCMS for Ukraine relief and \$750.00 to Mercy Chefs who are now in Poland preparing meals for the Ukrainian refugees. We are also sending \$200.00 to Hope Lutheran Church's food pantry, \$200.00 to Free Kind to aid in their mission of saving young people from being caught up in the Human Trafficking in our area, and \$200.00 to St Columba Ecumenical Ministry in Norfolk who assist men in need of shelter, job training, clothing, etc. Lastly, we will be sending to LWR \$200 to assist in Mid-West Tornado damage.

Thank you to all who came forward to make shawls and donate yarn. We blessed 8 new shawls at our meeting. If you plan to donate yarn we would recommend that you look for yarn that shows a number "4" on the packaging and suggest you buy 3 skeins of yarn in the same color. Color is your choice. All selections are welcome.

The List Changes Daily – Help for Ukraine

An excerpt from an article in The Reporter (Official Newspaper of The Lutheran Church-Missouri synod March 1, 2022

As the situation in Ukraine continues, the church prays and provides for those affected.

In a recent email, the Rev. James A. Krikava, associate executive director of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Office of International Mission (OIM), Eurasia and Asia Operations, explained that the OIM is already working with several church bodies in Europe to help those affected by this crisis.

This work includes aid for our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine (ELCU) and other refugees.

The OIM is currently working with five Lutheran churches to help refugees from this conflict. These church bodies are located in Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Germany and the Czech Republic.

The Rev. Serge Maschewski, bishop of the ELCU, requests funds for medicine; fuel for the evacuation of children, women and the elderly; food; and personal safety gear for pastors who work in dangerous areas. Maschewski said that the needs are always changing: "I don't know the exact amount of money. Today we need food. Tomorrow we need medicine. The list changes daily."

In a recent email to Krikava and LCMS President Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, Maschewski said, "I want to give special thanks to the faithful of the LCMS, and personally to President Harrison and Pastor Krikava. God bless you! We, by the power of God, will overcome all things, and the Lord will grant us victory!"

The Lord Jesus, who talked about coming wars and calamities, died and rose from the dead to forgive sins and give eternal life to all who believe. Before He ascended, He promised His church, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20). The church prays for peace in our world and for faith as we await His coming.


