## **Drawing Close to God this Summer**

- 3. Connect the Love of Jesus to Others: I invite everyone to be on the lookout for God to provide opportunities for you to share His love, His kindness and mercy to some one you bump into maybe just once or someone that you see every single day. Maybe invite a senior to the special service we will have over the summer just for them. Or invite a child to the outreach events Trinity will be hosting this summer. Or just simply hand a bible or invite someone to church! None of this is hard and it all can be done with the strength the Holy Spirit provides!

# **Church Property**

A very special thank you to all who helped to create our Handicapped Bathroom (for men and women) by the hallway coming in from the parking lot. This bathroom will serve as our Men's bathroom and the smaller bathroom will serve as our Ladies bathroom. There are still a few things to finish in both bathrooms, but we wanted everyone to know how much this work of love means to those who need it.

Our new awning covering the doors and handicapped ramp coming in from the parking lot should be installed soon!

We are certainly very blessed to have Bill Sontag serving as our Sexton. There is so much that he does for Trinity behind the scenes. You may have noticed the potatoes and onions in the Welcome Center from the Church Garden that are available thanks to Bill's gardening skills.

Another thing that Bill does for Trinity is to collect items for recycling. He turns these in and adds money to the "Sexton's Stash" that helps cover many expenses normally covered by the church budget.

Items recycled Include:

Aluminum
Aluminum cans
Copper
Insulated copper
Circuit boards
Steel
Air conditioner radiators
Electric motors
Sealed units (compressors)
Engines and engine parts



Items that have been purchased with funds from recycling include:

paint, nails, lumber, keys, inner tubes for mowers, shop supplies, motor oil, filters, gasoline, spark plugs, drop cloths, door latches, batteries, lubricating oil for pumps, tile grout, soil additives, wheels, tape, caulk, paint brushes, 20 volt drill, pipes for toilets/sinks/water heater, shop towels, light bulbs, cement/mortar mix, fence posts, porch lights, chemicals for AC water treatment (algae control), azalea plants for front of church, nuts and bolts, shovel handle, ant spray, light ballasts, garden hose attachments, water heater exhaust pipe, garden plants and supplies, pressure washer hose

NOTE – Most everything was purchased with appropriate coupons/discounts/sales and/or 10% Military discount, thus saving the church even more!!!

The following amounts were collected from recycling over the past several years!

2018	\$251.10
2019	\$238.40
2020	\$106.21
2021	\$985.67
2022	\$585.47
Totaling	\$2166.85

In addition to the recycling listed above, Bill helps with the Office Depot/Office Max Rewards Program.

Recycle a maximum of 10 printer ink cartridges per month for \$2.00 per cartridge for a max of \$20.00 per month in rewards/dollars.

\*To qualify for each month rewards a purchase of a minimum of \$10.00 in "non-discounted" merchandise must be made – each month Bill purchases items he can use personally so that the church qualifies for the reward.

The church started collecting empty ink cartridges in January 2021.

The first purchase made with reward points was in March 2021 and was a case of bulletin size paper valued at \$72.58.

Another case of bulletin size paper was purchased with reward points in June 2021 valued at \$72.58.

Rewards points of \$40.59 were used towards the purchase of a new fax machine.

A third case of paper was purchased with reward points in November 2021 valued at \$92.44.

A fourth case of paper was purchased with reward points in January 2022 valued at \$79.83.

A fifth case of paper was purchased with reward points in April 2022 valued at \$79.83.

Total saved to date is \$437.85.

We owe Bill a huge shout of gratitude for all he does to help save Trinity through his recycling efforts. A special thank you also to everyone who contributes the items to be recycled. All metal items are collected behind the shed in the parking lot. The ink cartridges are collected in the hallway recycling bin by the parking lot doors.

## **Special Ministries**

We hope everyone is enjoying their summer!

Along with other Southeastern District LCMS churches, we are supporting the Lutheran Social Services of the National Capital Area by donating PRE-FILLED backpacks for refugee youth in Virginia. For the month of July we will be collecting backpacks and school supplies for children in grades 3 - 5. Backpacks need to be in gender neutral colors and designs. We have signed up to supply 20 backpacks with supplies, so we will need 20 each of the following items -

Backpack Box of Crayons Box of Markers or Colored Pencils 10 #2 Pencils Pencil Sharpener Pencil Box or Pouch 3 big Glue Sticks 5 Folders with Pockets 3-Ring Binder (1-2 inch) Pack Wide Ruled Paper **Pair Scissors** 2 Erasers 2 Highlighters Pack of 3x5 index cards 2 Wire Bound Notebooks 2 Composition Notebooks Ruler (inches and centimeters)

All items need to be turned in by Sunday, July 31st.

Keep an eye out for when we will be making sand-wiches for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries, Inc. We will be doing it hopefully in July and August. We will make the sandwiches after church. Dates to be announced. We would also like to include with the sandwiches a few of the other items that go into the bagged lunches for the Day Center. The other items we will try to get are granola bars, beef jerky and bottled water. Many hands make for light work. We hope you will be able to stay after church to help make the sandwiches. If you have never made them before it goes fast and the conversation while making the sandwiches is fun! Hope you will join us! We hope to get a Thrivent Action Grant for this project.

Near the end of September you will be able to pick up a shoebox for *Samaritan's Purse* - *Operation Christmas Child*. This year we will have 30 boxes that will need to be filled. A special thank you to Cathy George for getting the shoeboxes and applying for Thrivent "seed money" to pay for the mailing of the boxes. You will have the entire month of October to fill your box and return to church. The final day for returning the boxes will be October 30<sup>th</sup>, which just happens to be Reformation Sunday! We have done *Operation Christmas Child* for several years now and it continues to be a ministry in which all seem to participate. Cathy George started this mission when she was chair of the Outreach Committee and Special Ministries carries it on.

A **BIG** thank **you** to everyone who donated to our food drive during the month of May. We collected a grand total of 385 pounds of food for the Foodbank of Southeastern VA. That means we were able to provide 320 meals to those less fortunate in our very own community! We also collected \$120 in monetary donations. Those funds are put to great use by the buying power the Foodbank. For every \$10 donated the Foodbank is able to distribute up to \$60 worth of grocery products back into our community. The food drive would not be successful without our caring congregation, who are always willing to help. A special THANK YOU to Jo-Nell and David Chadwick for applying for the matching funds of \$250 from Thrivent. Without this seed money our totals to help those in need would have been less. Jo-Nell and David also delivered the food to the Foodbank. Thank you to everyone for your support to this vital ministry!

If you have been at church the last few weeks, "Farmer Bill" (a.k.a. Bill Sontag), has been putting out the church garden goodies. The potatoes and onions are plentiful this year. If all items are not taken on Sunday, Bill will donate them to the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia. If you were unaware, we have a church garden. Take a walk to the other side of the building and you will see a lush garden growing. A BIG thank you to "Farmer Bill" for keeping up the garden!! The garden was originally to be a community garden that the school children would help plant and maintain. Bill has kept this going even after the school closed. Now that the trees on that side of the church have been cut down one wonders if the garden will expand? There is even a rain barrel for watering the garden painted by the former Summer Camp children.

DID YOU KNOW: Thrivent Action Teams are a great way to make a positive impact in your community. Simply gather a team of neighbors or friends for a fundraiser, educational event or service activity. Thrivent offers all the resources you need to get started, including up to \$250 in seed money. Your team provides the passion that brings your project to life. We try to utilize Thrivent Action Teams funds for our community outreach projects. If you are a Thrivent member you are eligible to apply for seed money twice a year.

Heading on vacation or that long awaited get away? Just a friendly reminder, that we are still collecting **hotel sample sized soap, shampoo, conditioners,** etc.... We hope to have a packing party of all the collected items to be able to give to those less fortunate in our own community. St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries in Norfolk, VA will be the recipient of these items that we hope to present at the time of delivering the sandwiches.

**DID YOU KNOW**: We also collect used **toner cartridges**? Office Max/Depot Recycling Rewards will give you credit for them towards future purchases. So, next time your toner is running low and you are getting ready to pitch it, *please don't* and bring it in.

We also collect **used prescription glasses** that are donated to the Lion's Club locally. So, if you have an old prescription pair of glasses laying around bring them to church so they can get on the nose of someone who is unable to afford glasses. **DID YOU KNOW**: That there are millions of people who are unable to see due to the inability to afford glasses!

We are **always** collecting **diapers** from newborn to adults and everything in between year-round. The diapers are donated to the **Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank**. The need there is always great. If your package is open that is alright as long as the size in known. So, if your little one outgrew their diapers and you had half a package left, bring it to church. Just tape it closed so the diapers don't fall out of the bag/box. Again, making a difference in our community!

We are still collecting **new and gently loved books** for children of all ages for **R.E.A.C.H.** (Reading Enriches All Children). As your child grows and those baby books are no longer used, bring them in. From board books to chapter books, we collect them all year-round!


