Dear Trinity Lutheran Church Family,

As 2023 begins, we also begin the church calendar season of Epiphany. The 2022-2023 church calendar started in 2022 with Advent and then Christmas. The 12 days of Christmas started 25 December and go to Epiphany (6 January).

Then, we are in the Epiphany Season until Lent. "Epiphany" comes meaning "manifestation" Greek epiphaneia, "appearance." In 2 Timothy 1:9-10, the word is used to refer to the manifestation of Jesus Christ: This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel (NIV). In the context of the Church year, Epiphany refers to the appearance of Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world—of Israel and the Gentiles. For this reason, Epiphany is commonly associated with the visitation of the Magi (or "wise men"), who were almost certainly Gentiles, in Matthew 2:1-12. The scope of the Epiphany Season also includes all of Jesus' childhood events, his baptism by John and the wedding at Cana. During Epiphany we focus on the mission of the Church to reach all the peoples of the earth, and the great gift of God's grace in revealing healing truth and light to the world.

Next comes Lent. Ash Wednesday on 22 February begins the Lenten Season this year. We Christians receive ash on our foreheads in the sign of the cross and hear words based on Genesis 3:19, "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return." Lent is 40 days long (not including the Sundays) representing the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness. It is a season of repentance to prepare us for Easter.

God's blessings to you and yours during Epiphany and Lent.

MOVING TRINITY FORWARD

As announced at our last Voters' Assembly, the Board of Stewardship has started a new building improvement fund raiser entitled – MOVING TRINITY FORWARD FUND. This will be a 5-year campaign beginning January 1, 2023 with a goal of \$250,000. This fund will help support a renovation of our heating and cooling systems, support updates to the building to cover safety and security, a renovation of our playground, and updates to our roof and wiring throughout the building. Pastoral Visits

Your Past Does Not Define Your Future

New Year's is a celebration of the past and the future. We take stock of the past with thanksgiving and sometimes even relief (that it's over), and we look to the future in hope and anticipation, and perhaps with some worry, for what it holds.

The point is that New Year's celebrations remind us of who we are as opposed to who we would like to be, what we have done in comparison to what we want to do. It reminds us of our accomplishments, but mostly it reminds us of our failures. What we've lost. Who we've lost.

New Year's is our own version of Charles Dickens' classic, *A Christmas Carol*. And we all play Scrooge. We are visited by the ghosts of our pasts, presents and futures.

St. Paul writes: "The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. As it is written, 'He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever.' He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for all your generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God" (2 Cor. 9:6–15).

St. Paul tells us that the Lord will both supply and increase what we need to give to the church for its work in the world. He tells us that this work God does in us will enrich and bless us in every way, and through this, will produce thanksgiving to God. With this in mind, here is some practical advice to help you take stock of your giving in years past and change what needs to be adjusted, improved, or done away with altogether.



First, attend the Divine Service to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. If you've not been faithful in attending worship to hear the preaching of God's Word, to receive forgiveness and feast on the rich food of our Lord's body and blood for the eternal benefit of your body and soul, then repent and come to receive the gifts God freely gives. God doesn't want your money. He wants you — all of you (Matt. 22:20–22).

Second, pray for the Lord's help. Your right as a Christian is to speak with your Father, the King of all creation, freely through His Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. Go to the throne of grace and ask for strength and wisdom to follow His bidding faithfully (John 15:1–16).

Third, consider what the church is and what the church does. The church is a place of mercy. It inhales the mercy of the Father by the death, resurrection and ascension of His Son through the preaching of the Gospel and the Sacraments. It exhales this mercy in love toward neighbors. You are a member of the church, of God's family. Thus, you are not only a recipient of God's mercy, but a bearer of that mercy for the life of the world. You spread that mercy through the generous giving of your income to support the work of the church in the world, as the Israelites did in the Old Testament (Lev. 27:1–34).

Fourth, take stock of your current giving in light of the New Testament's teaching on supporting the work of the church. Are you giving of your first fruits, taking it out of your paycheck first, or does God get what's left over? Are you giving voluntarily and cheerfully? Are you giving proportionally and generously? The Old Testament required a tithe, or ten percent. The New Testament gives freedom to be generous, to give more for the Church's work. Are you relying on God's promise to provide and increase what you need to do His work? If your answer is no to any of these, repent. If God gave you His only Son, will He not provide for you all things, even physical things? Trust Him, His Word, and heed it.

So, don't let your past define your future. Rather, commit for the year a generous proportion of your income, which is God's gift to you for this body and life.

Some highlights from our last meeting and moving forward -

- Church Properties The Board will be looking at replacing our kitchen floor. A line item has been added to the 2023 budget to help cover this building improvement. The playground will also be receiving a facelift including a new border and new swing set. With the implementation of a new building fund entitled Moving Trinity Forward, we will see a renovation of our heating and cooling systems, updates to the building to cover safety and security, a renovation of our playground, and updates to our roof and wiring throughout the building.
- Call Committee After receiving a list of 9 candidates from our District President. The committee ended up with a list of their top 5 candidates. Following interviews and not finding the Pastor they felt the Lord was leading to Trinity, they requested a new list of candidates from the District President. They are currently waiting for this new list and plan on continuing the Call Process as soon as this list arrives! - Cleaning out the building We are now collecting boxes to help with the packing up for saving, donating and discarding items in. Look for work parties will be held in 2023.

- Food drive in November for the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia was very successful.


