Dear Church,

He is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

First, I want to say "Thank you" to Almighty God for your salvation - our salvation. We are indeed saved by grace alone. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast." Jesus lived a perfect life for us. His passion, death and resurrection from the dead reconcile us to God the Father. Jesus saves us from our sin, death and the devil. During the Easter Season we remember what God has done for us in Christ Jesus. Fun fact: In 325 the Council of Nicea decreed that Easter should be observed on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox (March 21). Easter, therefore, can fall on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25.

Second, I want to say "Thank you" to you for all you do to serve Christ and His Church. You have all been blessed by God to be a blessing to others. As you well know, "We are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). God has a mission to save all people with the power of His Gospel. We, the church, focus on this mission during the season of Pentecost. Fun fact: Pentecost takes place on the 50th day after Easter.

God uses you/us to share that Gospel message. So we live our lives empowered by His Holy Spirit to do good works. In this way, we contribute to His mission. Now, these works do not save us. But God may use our good works to bring others to Himself. Since Epiphany (January 6), you as a congregation have done the following (and more) to love your neighbor and advance God's Kingdom:

- Witnessed new birth in Holy Baptism as we welcomed a new baptized member into God's family
- Used of your time/talents to serve God's church

- Shared fellowship while raising money to support the LWML League Fund at our Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper
- Made soup for Lenten Suppers and then ate soup gathered in Christian fellowship
- Prayed for others
- Gave money to God in the offering plate
- Welcomed our pastoral candidate Pastor Chris Conkling and his wife Bridget with Christian love and hospitality.

Safety and Security Committee

The Church Council has approved this committee proceed with our plan to apply for a 2023 Nonprofit Security Grant from FEMA. The application must be submitted by April 26, 2023 but we hope to have the application ready before Easter.

The Grant will cover the following:

- Install Ballistic Glass in the windows of the two sets of doors on the parking lot side and one set of doors near the restrooms on the Belvedere side
 - Install Ballistic Film on all windows on the North, East and South side of the building
- (These two items will prevent, or at least significantly slow, any intruder from gaining entry to the Church.)*
- Install exterior cameras and related monitoring system.
 - Upgrade the Security Alarm and include panic alarms.
 - Purchase Handheld Radios.

We are finalizing the costs related to these items. There will be no cost to Trinity.

For your information, we will not learn if our application is approved until at least September. If approved, funds will not be available until March 2024 at the earliest.

Board of Stewardship

Stewardship Gifts*

“... so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was according to the eternal purpose that he has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him” (Eph. 3:10–12).

What is the goal of our stewardship? This is really the WHY question of stewardship. Human beings were created for the task of being stewards. Read Genesis chapters one and two and we will see this. We were created to have dominion and subdue creation in a way that reflects the image of God in which we were created. This takes place in the way that we work and keep the creation entrusted to us by God. The only problem we have with stewardship is found in Genesis chapter three. There, in an act of rebellion and sin, stewards named Eve and Adam claimed ownership over that which God had created them to steward. We have a word for claiming ownership over something that belongs to another. That word is theft. But they were stealing more than a fruit. They were stealing God's place and God's glory! Ever since that fateful day in the garden, we have followed suit. What God has given us to steward, we have attempted to own. So, God once again shows His glory in establishing the eternal purpose of Jesus Christ. In going to the cross, Jesus restores us in forgiveness to the task of once again stewarding what God has given us. Forgiven and restored in Jesus, we are once again stewards. Not just of creation, but of the Gospel as it is served by creation, including us! Today we pray again that we would be able to recognize the simple gifts the Lord has given us to steward for the sake of the Gospel. In this we make known the manifold wisdom of God. As we faithfully steward the simple gifts God has entrusted to us, we point people to the redemption and restoration of our stewardship through Jesus Christ. Remember, the world sees Jesus through your stewardship. What are you showing the world in how you steward God's simple gifts?

Prayer

Gracious Lord, as Your light has arisen upon us in the light of the world that is Jesus, so let Your light shine in and through us today and every day. Grant us the grace to identify and use the simple gifts You call us to share in the light of Your grace today and throughout this year. Amen.

Church Properties

The playground overhaul is well under way. The Church Council approved the purchase of the 5 inch Little Tykes swing set from MTS Recreations at approx.. \$7,000. The 2023 budget has a line item for the swing set at \$3,000. This will put the swing set budget over approx. \$4,000. This additional expenditure (\$4,000) goes before the Voters' for approval since we are not allowed to make a purchase over \$2,500 without Voters' approval.

We are going to add some mulch to the playground before Easter. Two loads of 10 cubic yards will be delivered before Easter and another after the swing is installed. A 4th load will be added next spring.

I will be adding an outside light to the northwest corner of the building. There were ashes in the bushes where somebody had a cookout.

The kitchen floor replacement is on hold until after Easter. It will require another quote because of the time delay.

I will be adding a light and some kind of audio alert in the office to monitor the front door. We are also thinking about a larger monitor for the security camera monitoring.

There was a leak in the roof near the handicap washroom. Bill was able to find and fix it.

The Trustees are looking for volunteers to mow the church's lawn this summer. If you are willing to help, please sign-up on the sheet in the Welcome Center. We will be organizing in two person "teams". With two people working, it usually takes about one hour to cut, trim and edge the lawn. Each team will be responsible for cutting the grass on a rotating schedule. The number of teams and frequency of their duty will depend on the number of volunteers. Please contact John Knickelbein for more details.

HVAC Upgrade - from Bud Hubert - The engineer is working on the specs and bid proposals for the cooling tower and the HVAC units themselves. The cooling tower is the first priority. He has several companies that he will recommend that we seek to bid on the job. We should have these in hand soon.

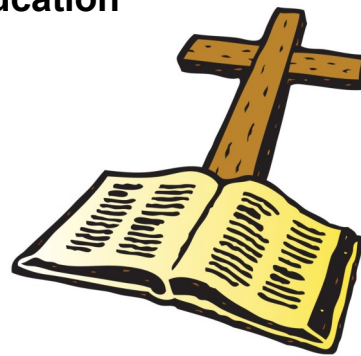
Valentines and Easter cards have been sent to Trinity's homebound members.

THANK YOU to everyone who contributed to our November food drive. Trinity collected **422 pounds of food** for the **Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore**. When you break that down it equates to 352 meals, in our own community. A special thank you to Elizabeth Baroody for applying for Thrivent "seed money" for the food drive. With the "seed money" protein rich items such as stews, canned meats, beans, sardines and many other items were purchased.

We will be holding another **food drive** during the **month of April**. You can bring your canned and dry goods to church on Sunday or during the week when the office is open. You may leave the canned/dry goods on the pew inside the side entrance. The food will be taken to the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore the first week in May. If you would like to volunteer to take the food to the Foodbank, please contact Patty Malone.

Our 2022 - "**Operation Christmas Child**" shoe boxes went to **Malawi and Uruguay**. A special thank you to Cathy George for getting the shoeboxes and applying for Thrivent "seed money" to pay for the mailing of the boxes. Thank you to everyone who took a book and returned it. As you can see **our reach is worldwide!** We have been doing this mission outreach since 2014 and we continue to support "*Operation Christmas Child*." A special thank you to Lynn Hubert for putting up the bulletin board showing where all our shoe boxes have gone since 2014 to date. Look at the bulletin board in the hallway that leads to Belvedere Hall. It is amazing to see how far our reach from 6001 Granby Street really is! We could not have done any of this without the support of the congregation, we **THANK YOU!**

Trinity supported the **Lutheran Social Services of the National Capital Area** by donating pre-filled backpacks for refugee youth in Virginia. They could not believe how nice the backpacks were and were very grateful for our support. A **big thank you** goes out to Tina Studer and her granddaughters for driving the backpacks to Northern Virginia. It was a great day trip for Grandma and granddaughters!

Trinity was so gracious in donation of the school supplies for the backpacks that the remaining items donated were taken to Granby Elementary School. Thank you, Gerald Harger, for taking the extra supplies to the school. So, as you can see one project helped statewide and locally.

If you did not know, we collect diapers year-round. The diapers can be for infants through adult sizes. The box, inside the parking lot door entrance, was full and they were recently taken to the **Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank** by Anne Starke and her granddaughter. There were a little over **800 diapers of varying sizes!** You can donate opened packages of diapers as they split into smaller packages before distribution to families.

The *Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank* currently collects and distributes 25,000 diapers each month to nearly 40 partners working with babies, adults, and the disabled in Hampton Roads.

Diaper need is more than a footnote. Here are the facts:

- 1 in 3 American families reports experiencing diaper need.
- 5.2 million children in the U.S. aged three or younger live in poor or low-income families.
- Infants require up to 12 diapers per day. Toddlers require about 8 diapers per day.
- Disposable diapers can cost \$70 to \$80 per month per baby.
- No state or federal child safety-net program allocates dollars specifically for the purchase of diapers.
- Without transportation, buying diapers at a convenience store rather than a large "big box" store can significantly increase the monthly cost of diapers.

Most childcare centers - even free and subsidized facilities - require parents to provide a day's supply of disposable diapers.

We are looking for a **date in April** to make sandwiches after church for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries. The last time we made sandwiches we also packed up all the sample sized items we had and made over 80 hygiene kits. The staff at St. Columba were extremely happy to receive those items as it is something they do not get a lot of. They were also grateful for the sandwiches we provided.

We continue to collect **hotel sample sized soap, shampoo, conditioners; printer ink cartridges; used prescription glasses; and new or gently loved books** for children of all ages. Our collection bin is in the Special Ministry corner right inside the parking lot doors, labeled -

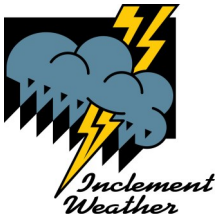
