Dear Church,

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Did you know that we follow a church calendar year? It is a wonderful gift we have inherited from the Christians whom came before us. The calendar revolves around events in the life of our Lord Jesus and His Church.

From Advent through the Easter Season is the first part of the church calendar year. During this time we focus on the perfect life of Jesus Christ. Then, we focus on his passion, death and resurrection. At the end of the Easter season Jesus ascended into heaven. So to recap: this church year began in December 2022 with Advent. Then, we celebrated Christmas and the twelve days of Christmas. Then, the Magi came on Epiphany. Ash Wednesday began the 40 days of the Lenten Season. Palm Sunday began Holy Week. Then, we moved into Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Season.

The second part of the church calendar year starts with Pentecost. The focus is on the life of the church. On Sunday, May 28 we celebrated Pentecost and received new members into our congregation. That day the color of the paraments, vestments, and altar cloths was red as we focused on the power of the Holy Spirit coming down, filling and then enabling the disciples with power. The following week was Trinity Sunday and we received another family into fellowship. The liturgical color for that day was white, which is the color of purity and completeness. Now, we are in the Pentecost season of the church year and the color has shifted to green, symbolic of new life and growth.

Indeed, new life and growth for all people is God's mission. We, the church, focus on this mission during the season of Pentecost which started in June and goes until November.

During this Season of Pentecost, I challenge you to share the Gospel with one other person - preferably a non churched person. Invite that person to come to church with you. Pray for him or her. Growth is the Holy Spirit's job. We plant and water.

1 Corinthians 3:5-9 says, **5** What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each. **6** I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. **7** So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. **8** He who plants and he who waters are one, and each will receive his wages according to his labor. **9** For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building.

Board of Stewardship

Below is the letter that was sent to all members and Active Guests of Trinity in June. As we continue our Moving Trinity Forward Campaign we ask that if you have not yet returned your pledge, please do so to help us manage our resources. We mailed 98 letters and to date we have received 12 pledges. (Pledges forms are available in the Church Office if you need one.)

Dear Trinity Family,

We, the blessed people of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, have just celebrated our 103^{rd} Anniversary—God is good! At the beginning of 2023, the Board of Stewardship rolled out the "Moving Trinity Forward" Campaign. This is a <u>five-year campaign</u> that will enable Trinity to be here for many generations to hear and proclaim God's word. Our goal was \$50k per year with an ultimate goal of \$250k. We are six months into this campaign with a current balance of less than \$5,000.

This fund will support renovations of our heating and cooling systems, updates to the building (safety and security), improvements to our roof, and wiring upgrades throughout the building. This will allow God's people through the Holy Spirit to use Trinity to grow the Church.

As we embark on our 104th year and beyond, we are asking that you prayerfully consider joining us in making a meaningful pledge *in addition to your regular tithes and offerings*. This will be a time-bound campaign, with a spiritual commitment to an amount for each year from 2023 to 2027.

There are multiple means for you to provide your tithes and offerings, and we would like to offer these options for that as well as for your pledge over the remaining years of this stewardship campaign:

- Giving via cash/check
- Setting up ACH through VANCO (Please consult with Anne in church office)
- Offering appreciated stock or mutual funds (Please consult with Anne in church office)
- Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) / Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

- Employer matching charitable-gift program (Please consult with your company)

In addition to the above pledge options, we would also like to remind our faithful of other possibilities by which to offer stewardship-based support to maintain and grow the church:

Easter cards (25) were sent by deacons.


A welcoming reception, hosted by the Board of Deacons, was held on Sunday, May 28th as five new members joined TLC.



Communion visits continue to the homebound. Deacons Bud Hubert, Ken Leiding and Roger Medlin provide this service.



Heading on vacation or that long awaited get away? Just a friendly reminder, that we are still collecting **hotel sample sized soap, shampoo, conditioners** etc.

We also collect <u>used prescription glasses</u> that are donated to the Lion's Club locally. 
