Dear Church,

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

We continue to talk about church calendar year. As you remember, Advent through Easter is the first part of the church calendar year. During this time we focus on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Come December 3rd, we will begin a new church calendar year (2023-2024) with the Season of Advent. There are four Sundays in Advent as we prepare our hearts and minds for Christ's coming as a baby in Bethlehem and also his coming again to judge the living and the dead. Each week, we will lite a candle (Hope, Love, Joy and Peace) until we light the Christ Candle Christmas Eve.

Currently, we remain in the second part of the church calendar year. October and November are still the Pentecost Season with focus on the life of the church. This year we have twenty-five Sundays after Pentecost. However, depending on the date of Easter, a church year could have as many as twenty eight Sundays in the season of Pentecost. During Pentecost we observe two special Sundays: October 29th is Reformation Sunday and November 5th is All Saints' Sunday. Reformation commemorates the start of the Protestant Reformation which can be summed up by five solas: Christians are saved by grace alone (Sola Gratia), through faith alone (Sola Fide), in Christ alone (Solus Christus), as revealed by Scripture alone (Sola Scriptura), to the glory of God alone (Soli Deo Gloria). All Saints' remembers men and women who believed these five solas and died in the Christian faith. They are now in the Church Triumphant with the Lord.

In the last newsletter, I challenged you (the Church Militant - on earth) to share the Gospel during the Pentecost Season with one other person. How did that go? I hope well. This is called to witness. **Witness** is the work we do as the church scattered. Each of us have opportunities to speak of Jesus with the people in our everyday lives who are our friends, co-workers, neighbors and family members. **Outreach** is the work we do as the church gathered. It is our collective effort through ministries, services, events and other activities as the church through which we invite and include others into Word and Sacrament ministry.

Remember, God calls us to be faithful in our witness and our outreach. He alone creates saving faith.

Not Even One District Initiative

Dear Trinity family,

Our Southeastern District has partnered with *MinistrySafe* to offer "Not Even One", an initiative to train and equip Southeastern District (SED) congregations to reduce the risk of Child Sexual Abuse. We have signed up for this free yearlong resource that will aid us in protecting children, volunteers, and the church.

SED congregations such as Trinity are entrusted with the care and nurture of children and youth. The statistics are troubling; one in four girls and one in six boys in the U.S. are abused before the age of eighteen.

The Executive Board, with the aid of Patty Malone, has used the recommendations of *MinistrySafe* and our insurer, *Brotherhood Mutual*, to develop a concise Safeguarding Policy that we will be following for activities involving the supervision of children and youth.

One way you can contribute to this effort is by signing up for free awareness training for yourself. Please add your name to the signup list in the Welcome Center if you would like an online training emailed to you. It's in the Way that You Use It

Consider the humble baseball bat. It is a simple tool designed for a complex task. The batter needs a tool that can consistently deliver force to a small ball which may be thrown at over 100 miles per hour, but which might also come slanting across the plate as a slow curve. For a game like this, the founders of baseball had to redesign the old cricket bat, which is more of a flat paddle. The tool had to fit the job.

But even a specially-designed tool can be used for a different purpose. It turns out that some years ago in England, the home of cricket, baseball bats suddenly started selling like hotcakes. What were folks across the pond doing with all those baseball bats? Using them as clubs in riots!

A tool can be used, and it can be misused. It's all in the way that you use it.

The same is true with the things of God. The Second Commandment states that we should "not misuse the name of the Lord." In the Small Catechism, Luther goes on to tell us exactly what this misuse is, as well as the proper use:

We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

The Lord has given us His name: He has placed it upon us in Holy Baptism and He has invited us to pray to Him as our Father. In this sense, the Lord's name is something for us to use. We should not misuse it ... and we should not fail to use it. The Pharisees of old were so afraid of misusing the name of God that they decided to simply never say the name of God (YHWH, Jehovah) at all! This non use is just as bad as misuse. The Lord gives His gifts for our use.

A Christian steward is one who is called to use all of God's gifts for His purposes. This includes things like the Name of God, the Sacraments and the Word, and it also includes things like our family and friends, our talents and skills, our money and resources. Everything that God has given to you, He has given to you so that you may be blessed to use it for His kingdom.

It's all in the way that you use it!

We will again meet to decorate the church for Christmas. Join us after service on December 10th to help decorate the trees and the sanctuary.


