

Brothers and Sisters,

In his book the *Care of Souls*, Harold Senkbeil, an LCMS pastor and executive director emeritus of Doxology, explains how growing up on a farm prepared him for pastoral care. In every occupation people acquire skill through practice until occupation turns to vocation. As a boy, he witnessed his father acquiring "the habitus of farming" by doing what a farmer does until his father had a nose for it. In fact, by smelling the soil he knew what to do. "When the habits of a habitus begin to inhabit a workman, he becomes a craftsman and his work a true craft". Similarly, shepherding souls "is a habitus before it is a vocation". Pastors learn with time and experience.

Pastoral care is also like sheep-dogging or being a sentinel. The dog is not the shepherd but looks to the shepherd for guidance as it protects and cares for the sheep. Pastors are sheepdogs who look to the Good Shepherd of the sheep for guidance as they provide care. Additionally, pastors are sentinels; Jesus is the warrior. Pastors sound the alarm. The enemy is sin, death, and the devil. A "most important skill [for the pastor] to acquire is the art of listening to the conscience". His target is to deliver a good conscience before God (Coram Deo). Thus, "as spiritual physicians" the pastoral task "is to treat bad consciences". Confession and absolution are the means by which a pastor treats and then delivers a good conscience to God. Sinners sin. "But if we confess our sin, God is faithful and just and forgives us of all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

Pastors speak words of forgiveness. "Everything we have to give as Christians we first receive from God ...". People need to hear the words of Jesus – not words about him but from him. Pastors only give what they received from the Lord. They speak Jesus' words and live Jesus' words so others can see how Christ makes life abundant.

"Jesus found joy in doing his Father's will because it was love in action". Right now, TLC's future pastor is acquiring more skill and practice so he can be a better pastor for you. Pray for him. That pastor will come soon to TLC and you will see his love in action. Until then, Jesus too gives us joy as we serve together as your vacancy pastors. Indeed, God is with us!

## WHY NOT TO GIVE

When we speak of stewardship, we regularly talk about giving a portion of our treasure (the three T's of stewardship are time, talent, and treasure). But we don't often focus on the motivation for giving. Let's look at some reasons for giving that are not in accordance with His word. We should not give competitively - that is, to compare what we give to what others do. Pride has no place in stewardship. We also should not give to ease a guilty conscience - Jesus' death on the cross releases us from guilt over past sins. One should never give to get a "favor" from God. God needs nothing from us. And last of all, one should never give to "get in good" with God - Christ has achieved that solely on his own merit.

So what should be our motivation for giving? We give out of gratitude for what Jesus has already done for us. "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver " (2 Cor. 9:7).

## **Special Ministries**

We would like to thank everyone who brought snack items and water in for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries during Lent. We will be counting, sorting and delivering the items after Easter. Stay tuned for time/date. The items collected get added to the sandwich ministry that St. Columba does daily. I want to give a special thank you to Anne Starke for making the cloth zipper bags that we are putting the items in.

May 2024 we will be collecting diapers for the Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank. We will be collecting ALL sizes and varieties of diapers. Did you know that 1 in 3 families don't have access to an adequate supply of diapers? The Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank has been working since 2012 to change the lives of babies, children with disabilities, and seniors in the Greater Hampton Roads Area. Greater Hampton Roads includes the following cities: Chesapeake, Gloucester, Hampton, Newport News, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Smithfield, Suffolk, Virginia Beach, Williamsburg and Yorktown.

Diaper need is more than a footnote. Here are the facts:

• Nearly half (47%) of American families report experiencing diaper need.

• 5.2 million children in the U.S. aged three or younger live in poor or low-income families.

• Infants require up to 12 diapers per day. Toddlers require about 8 diapers per day.

• Disposable diapers can cost \$70 to \$80 per month per baby.

• No state or federal child safety-net program allocates dollars specifically for the purchase of diapers. Without transportation, buying diapers at a convenience store rather than a large "big box" store can significantly increase the monthly cost of diapers.

Most childcare centers - even free and subsidized facilities - require parents to provide a day's supply of disposable diapers.

If your child has out grown a certain size of diapers they do take open packages, as long as the size is indicated. This includes children and adult diapers.

Please tell your friends about the "Diaper Drive". Many people have unused diapers and hold onto them because they know someone might need them. So spread the word and we look forward to a successful "Diaper Drive". June 2024 we will be making sandwiches for St. Columba Ecumenical Ministries. This is normally done after a church service in Belvedere Hall. Many hands make for light work! Thrivent will provide the seed money for the supplies as we provide the labor and love in getting the sandwiches made. Watch your bulletin for an exact date.

Don't forget about our **on-going projects** of prescription glasses that go to the Lion's Club; gently loved books that go to REACH; used stamps that help to purchase Bible's for prison ministry and toiletries from travelling that go into the homeless kits we put together.

Windows have been installed on the doors to the four classrooms on the first floor as well as the Nursery room. The kitchen floor has been replaced and the water damage repaired. The cost was covered by our insurance, minus the \$2500 deductible. The new cooling tower has been installed in the parking lot. We have received the Engineering Plans for the replacement of the HVAC unit in Belvedere Hall and the two units in the school wing. The unit in Belvedere Hall will be the first to be replaced. The Trustees will be meeting soon to discuss proceeding with that phase.

We are still looking for volunteers to assist with lawnmowing. Two person teams mow on a rotating basis, so the more volunteers we have, the less frequently each team needs to mow.
