

#### SPECIAL NOTE FROM PASTOR GUMZ

On Pastoral Ministry

John 21:16 - He said to him, "Tend my sheep."

Recently while teaching confirmation, I was asked what my job was. What is it that I do at work? Sometimes I think my kids wonder that too. They know I go to meetings and they know I preach on Sunday and teach Bible class, but what do I do all week?

I have found in ministry there are two types of church members and their knowledge of what their pastor does. One group believes I work one hour a week. The other group believes that I am so busy, I don't have time to be bothered. The truth is closer to the second than the first, but both aren't quite accurate.

Trinity has called me to the office of public ministry. This entails several aspects, and if you ever saw the call documents that are sent out to pastors, the job description is varied. Pastoral ministry is a job of many hats. Sometimes I meet with plumbers and electricians. Sometimes I meet with funeral directors and couples preparing to be married. I teach classes to middle schoolers and lead chapel at St. Paul's Lutheran school. I attend church council and voters meetings and keep an eye and ear open with the other groups in the church.

One of the more important tasks, beside preaching the Word and administrating the Sacraments, is pastoral care or tending the sheep. Jesus gives this command to Peter after the resurrection. Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves Him. Each time Peter says, yes and Jesus gives him a command. Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Feed my sheep.

Part of my job is to tend the people of the congregation God has sent me too. In my experience, this task is the most complex (and I learned Greek and Hebrew!). Each person, each sheep is different. Some are fiercely independent. Some are hurt but will not let you bind their wounds. Some come when they are called, and some must be sought again and again. Some never want to leave the barn.

It is also in this task that I have made the most mistakes, though some of those early sermons aren't pretty either. This task of care was made more complicated by COVID. Hospital visits were far more restricted than they have ever been. Homes felt off limits as they became personal safe havens from disease. Distance grew between members and between their shepherd.

So part of seeing the pandemic subside, is a reminder that your shepherd wants to know the sheep given to him to tend. I want to meet with you. I want to come to your homes. I want you to call me when you are in the hospital. I want to bring communion when you are too sick to come to church. I want to know about your jobs and the burdens you carry. I am not too busy to see you and to hear you.



#### **Blessing of Sacred Art**

Trinity recently had a "Blessing of Sacred Art" on Sunday, June 19<sup>th</sup> for the pieces received from Concordia Lutheran Church in Hammond at her closing. Concordia's last service was held Palm Sunday of 2021.

The two medallions were hand carved in Pietrasanta, Italy from linden wood and shipped to America, arriving in Kenosha WI. Potente Studios designed the crosses along with the Risen Christ that formerly served as the center piece at Concordia.


The Word and Spirit medallions sit atop four pieces of wood wrapped in antiqued bronze foil. From concept to installation, the whole piece took three years to complete. Along with our two pieces, Redeemer Lutheran Church in Highland now has the matching Risen Christ.

The two pieces of art adorn our sanctuary on the south side. The Word resides on the left and Baptism on the right of the entrance leading to the bell tower. They are placed there, so that as you leave the sanctuary, you are reminded of the gifts God gives to all of us in our daily life in faith.
