Dear Saints.

First, just a reminder that we are moving to an **audio-only livestream** on **March 2**, Ash Wednesday. You'll be able to find the stream by going to our website (trinityhuntley.org) and clicking on the "Listen" → "Live" tab at the top. Also, **all** of our services will be streamed, including our midweek and special services. (For more information about why we're making this change, see our February newsletter).

Second, Lent is just around the corner! As has been our custom, we will have Lenten midweek services on Wednesday nights at 7 pm, preceded by a supper at 6 pm (beginning on March 9). Each service will use candlelight and focus on a different part of the Small Catechism. We will also be utilizing some new contemplative music from the Taizé Community in France. I'd love to have you join us as we meditate together on all Christ has done and continues to do for us.

Last, I wanted to include a brief bit about the season of Lent. For over 1500 years, the Church has set aside time for prayer and other disciplines as they prepared to celebrate the feast of Easter. The goal of Lent is to reorient our hearts to focus on Jesus and all that he did for us by going to Jerusalem and dying on the cross. In recent decades, the Church across denominations has rediscovered the value and gift of Lent.

Lent traditionally has included three disciplines that Jesus lays out for us in Matthew 6: prayer, giving to the poor, and fasting. Traditionally, an individual would fast from certain foods or entire meals, which freed up time for prayer, and money to give to the poor. But a fast doesn't have to just be from food: it can be from other things that hinder you from loving God and neighbor.

If you aren't used to doing anything for Lent, I'd encourage you to start simple. A few ideas:

- In the third commandment, God commands us to come to church so he can bless us every seven days. Make a commitment to come to church every Sunday during Lent and receive God's mercy and life.
- Pick up one of our Lent devotions from the narthex (or ask us to bring one to you) and read it daily.
- Begin and end each day with the Lord's Prayer, or other short prayers such as: "Lord, have mercy." "Help me, Jesus." "Lord, protect and draw near to ______ today." "Lord, bless _____ today."

Lent is not about proving ourselves to Jesus. In fact, Lent is not really about us but about Jesus. It's about denying ourselves, so we focus less on ourselves and more on Jesus. It's about saying no to ourselves so we give Jesus an even fuller yes. Whatever you do, know this: if your Lenten disciplines help you love God and serve your neighbor, you've got it right; if not, it's gone wrong.

TRINITY RE-OPENING LETTER 2/20/22

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity:

First, let me thank you for your kindness and patience while COVID-19 and masks have continued to challenge our normal rhythm of church life. As individuals we were not of one mind during these troubles, but as a congregation we have held together remarkably well. The good will among us has been amazing!

Many of you probably saw that Gov. Pritzker is lifting the indoor mask mandate for all of Illinois, regardless of vaccination status, beginning February 28.

We've been guided by several touch points throughout this pandemic: maximizing love for our neighbor, shown primarily in abundant caution for those threatened by COVID-19, minimizing any COVID-19 related liabilities, and respect for earthly authorities (Romans 13).

The elimination of the indoor mask mandate, combined with plummeting hospitalization rates, widely available vaccines, anti-viral therapeutics, and medical-grade masks means these touchpoints are largely satisfied.

This means that we will be returning to church life as before on **Ash Wednesday, March 2. Masks will be optional**.

For those who have severe underlying health conditions or are immunocompromised, we will temporarily have a handful of medical grade (N-95) masks available in the narthex.

As we move ahead, everyone's comfort level will be different. Some will continue to mask; others will not. I encourage you to remember that you are all baptized into the one Body of Christ, and you need each other (1 Corinthians 14:12-27). Let's continue to walk together in unity, loving one another with Jesus' love that is "patient and kind" (1 Corinthians 14:4).

In the meantime, if you believe you will need special care, please be in touch with me as soon as possible.

As always, if you have any other questions or concerns, please contact me directly. Peace and joy!

The Village Team continues to review and develop additional building renovation ideas and plans. Perhaps we may have a better idea of plans and costs by early summer.

The Board's next meeting will be March 10th. The Board welcomes your input. A segment of each Board meeting, (second Thursday of the month, 6:30 pm) is reserved for Steward comments, suggestions or questions. A suggestion box is located in the Narthex.



GALLOPING HORSE QUILTERS by Marilee Payne

I was raised on a farm where there were always chores to do and many times chores that I hoped to escape. Mom always told my sister, my brother and me that many hands made the work light. Somehow that always proved to be the case. All of us working together could accomplish more than just one of us struggling with a task. I thought of my Mom's words this past week when working with the quilters to display our quilts for a variety of mission projects. Working together, nine quilters accomplished a lot and it seemed like a very easy task. The 149 quilts represented a years work, and many donations of fabric, sewing hours and \$\$\$. Oh yes, there was a lot of enjoyable fellowship while serving our Lord.

The 73 baby quilts were all delivered to the Elgin Pregnancy Center, a ministry of counseling and aid to pregnant women in our area. The need is such that the center has expanded to 3 more centers in the western suburbs. The quilts we took will be lovingly distributed by April this year. All quilts have a Bible verse stitched on them. 30 full sized quilts were also in our delivery as many of the Elgin Pregnancy Center clients are moving to living spaces new to them, and they are in need of many basic living supplies. It is our plan to make another baby quilt delivery to the Elgin Pregnancy Center in April.

Quilts also are going to Lutheran Church Charities for a variety of ministries in the Northern Illinois area. We will report more on that in the near future.

We have been asked why our quilts were not sent to Africa. The need is great there. The first few years of the Galloping Horses Quilters we sent everything we made to Lutheran World Relief for distribution in the foreign mission field. We then heard of needs in our immediate area and as a group decided we would do what we could more on a local level. All quilts have a Bible verse and the name and location of our church. Lutheran World Relief would not accept quilts with Bible verses. The quilters strongly believed this was an element we wanted to include in our ministry.

We invite anyone to join the Galloping Horses Quilters on the 2nd or 3rd Monday in the Trinity basement. People are needed to pin, cut, press, organize and sew. We also need financial donations to purchase supplies. Donations may be dropped in the collection plate on any Sunday and labeled "for the Galloping Horses". Join us for any of the above . 
