Having followed our Lord's life from Christmas to Easter, we have now entered into the second half of the Church Year known as Season after Pentecost or the Time of The Church or Ordinary Time. After celebrating the festivals of Christmas, Epiphany, Transfiguration, Easter, Pentecost and so on, the second half of the year can seem like going from vacation back to the ordinary, mundane routines of life.

This is however one of the main emphases of these Sundays--our everyday, ordinary lives as Christians. The season focuses on our Lord's teaching and our lives as His disciples, and so the liturgical color is green for growth. What exactly does it mean to live by faith? How do we live in the world but not of the world? How do we love our neighbor and witness to the hope we have in Christ? By the end of this season, we will hopefully have better answers to these questions!

Here's what the theologian Pius Parsch said regarding the Season after Pentecost:

"The Sundays during the Pentecost cycle develop three great themes. The first is Baptism and its graces. We are baptized and grounded in the graces of Baptism. Every Sunday is a reminder of Baptism and a small Easter. The second theme is preparation for the second Advent of the Lord. It is treated in detail on the final Sundays of the season. The remaining theme, the burden of the Sundays midway after Pentecost, may be summarized as the conflict between the two camps. Although we are placed in the kingdom of God, we remain surrounded by the kingdom of the world. Our souls are laboring under Adam's wretched legacy and waver continually to and fro between two allegiances.

"By these three great themes the liturgy covers the whole range of Christian life. In Baptism the precious treasure of the Spirit was conferred. Through it we are God's children and may call God Father. Through it we have become temples of the Holy Spirit, heirs and brothers of Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, Baptism has not translated us to a paradise without toil or trouble. Rather, we are sent out into a troubled world to work and struggle. We must guard the holy land of our souls against hostile attack. We must learn to know and conquer the enemy, and such is the task that will continue until we have taken our final breaths."

The Season after Pentecost focus on our Lord's teaching for us, His people, as we learn to live out our baptism, by the power of the Holy Spirit. But there is more! Parsch continues:

"The church serves as both the heroine, who teaches us the art of warfare, and our strong fortress and shield in the conflict. Through Holy Communion, she bestows aid that repeatedly frees the soul from the entanglements of temptation. How does she do this? Courage and strength and perseverance flow from the Word of God in the Service of the Word, and they flow in even fuller measure from Holy Communion. Of ourselves we are helpless creatures, wholly unable to withstand the attack, but in Holy Communion another battles for us. The Mightier, Christ, vanquishes the mighty. By means of Holy Communion, we are enrolled in our Captain's forces. And thus Christ's battle becomes our battle and His triumph our triumph, and His wondrous strength renders us invincible" (Pius Parsch, "The Church's Year of Grace", vol. 4: pp. 94-95).

Rooted in the living waters of God's Word and nourished by the holy food of the Lord's Supper, we are strengthened over this season to live as God' people in this world, to do His work where He has placed us, as we wait for and anticipate His coming again.

BOARD OF MINISTRY DIRECTORS *by Ken Ladage, Chairman*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

May Jesus Christ be praised, He is risen, alleluia. May what we do, may what we say and may what we write lead to praise of him who redeemed us, who brought the "Good News" of salvation to the entire world.

The Board of Ministry Directors presented for approval at the Congregational Voters Meeting on June 12th Trinity's and the TLC Preschool's July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023, annual budgets. Trinity's budget was prepared by the Budget Committee and submitted to the Board of Ministry Directors for their review, and subsequent presentation at the Voters Meeting for approval. Trinity's 2022-2023 has an anticipated income of \$394,035 and anticipated expenses of \$394,035. Major expenses include replacing the north side windows, parking lot resurfacing, advertising expense and office-balcony desktop computers. It is hard to judge the impact of inflation, consequently a 7% increase was added to all expense lines. The TLC Preschool budget was built on 80 students with an anticipated income of \$193,670 and anticipated expenses of \$193,670. To date 70 students are registered. Inflation increases of 7% were also included. After Congregational discussion, the two budgets were approved 27-0.

Due to the generous support of Trinity members, our financial position continues to be strong. This year's operating budget will end approximately \$29,000 in the black. During this year's budget the sacristy roof was replaced costing \$14,800. Due to the sale of the Parsonage a "Facility Maintenance and Improvement Fund" was established with \$106,000 and an Emergency/ Reserve fund with \$88,000. The Joyful Living account has \$561,000 to contribute to the next building project. Our current assets are approximately \$830,000. And most importantly, Trinity remains debt free.

Ed Dennis is chairing a newly created "Church Security Committee". The committee will review access control, personnel safety and support for staff and church members, medical emergency response, emergency notifications, fire safety, traffic control, cyber security, and weather emergencies.

The Village Team has developed a building expansion plan. Additional details will be added so that the General Contractor can develop a quote.

The Board's next meeting will be July 14th at 6:30 pm. The Board welcomes your input. A segment of each Board meeting is reserved for Steward comments, suggestions, or questions. A suggestion box is in the Narthex.

A NOTE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR *by Lana Gibbons*




**Rise, shine, you people! Christ the Lord has entered.
